

PROCEEDINGS OF JOINT CONVENTION.

SECOND SESSION—FEBRUARY 25, 1890.

The Common Council and Board of Aldermen of the City of Indianapolis, convened in second Joint Convention, in the Council Chamber, Tuesday evening, February 25th, A. D. 1890, at eight o'clock, pursuant to the following call:

Indianapolis, Ind., Feb. 21st, 1890.

To the Members of the Common Council and Board of Aldermen of the City of Indianapolis:

Gentlemen:—You are hereby requested to meet in Joint Convention in the Council Chamber, Tuesday evening, February 25th, 1890, at eight o'clock, for the transaction of such business as may come before the Convention.

PRESENT—Hon. Thomas L. Sullivan, President of the Joint Convention, in the Chair, and Aldermen Blackwell, Breunig, Farrell, Laüt, Reinecke, Reynolds, Smith, Smither, and President Thalman—9; Councilmen Austin, Cooper, Coy, Davis, Dunn, Gauss, Hicklin, Markey, Martindale, Murphy, Myers, McGill, Nolan, Olsen, Pearson, Rassman, Sechhan, Sweetland, Trusler, Woollen, and Yontz—22. Total, 31.

ABSENT, 4—viz: Alderman Reilly; Councilmen Gasper, Sherer, and Weber.

On motion by Councilman Yontz, it was ordered that the Joint Convention proceed to elect Market Masters to fill the vacancies in the East and West Markets, caused by the resignation the East Market Master, J. E. Isgrigg, and the arrest of West Market Master, Richard M. Wells.

The President appointed Alderman Smither and Councilman Austin to act as tellers.

Councilman Murphy placed in nomination for Market Master of the East Market, John P. Schiltges.

Alderman Thalman placed in nomination Joseph T. Shelton.

A ballot was then had, with the following result:

John P. Schiltges received.....	18 votes.
Joseph T. Shelton received.....	11 votes.

John P. Schiltges having received a majority of all the votes cast, the President declared him duly elected Market Master of the East Market for the unexpired term, ending December 31st, 1890.

For West Market Master, Alderman Farrell placed in nomination Thomas Kearney.

Councilman Sweetland placed in nomination Henry Moore.

A ballot was then had, with the following result :

Thomas Kearney received.....	18 votes.
Henry Moore received.....	11 votes.
Scattering.....	1 vote.

Thomas Kearney having received a majority of all the votes cast, the President declared him duly elected Market Master of the West Market for the unexpired term, ending December 31st, 1890.

On motion by Councilman Woollen, the Joint Convention adjourned, subject to the call of the President.
