

# PROCEEDINGS OF COMMON COUNCIL.

REGULAR SESSION—MARCH 17, 1890.

The Common Council of the City of Indianapolis, met in the Council Chamber, Monday evening, March 17th, A. D. 1890, at 7:30 o'clock, in regular session.

**PRESENT**—Hon. Thomas L. Sullivan, Mayor, and *ex officio* President of the Common Council in the Chair, and 18 members, viz: Councilmen Austin, Burns, Cooper, Coy, Dunn, Gauss, Hicklin, Martindale, Myers, McGill, Nolan, Olsen, Rassman, Sherer, Stechhan, Weber, Woollen, and Yontz.

**ABSENT**, 7—viz: Councilmen Davis, Gasper, Markey, Murphy, Pearson, Sweetland, and Trusler.

Councilman Hicklin introduced the following memorial resolution; which was unanimously adopted by a rising vote:

**WHEREAS**, At the fire in this city this afternoon, a number of the firemen were killed, and others wounded, be it

*Resolved by the Common Council of the City of Indianapolis*, That as a token of respect for the memory of the brave men who lost their lives in trying to save the property of our citizens, and as an evidence of our sympathy for those wounded in the same good cause, the Council will adjourn until next Friday evening, at half past seven o'clock.

On motion, the Common Council then adjourned until Friday evening, March 21st, 1890.
