

PROCEEDINGS OF BOARD OF ALDERMEN.

SPECIAL SESSION—MARCH 31, 1890.

The Board of Aldermen of the City of Indianapolis, met in the Aldermanic Chamber, Monday afternoon, March 31st, A. D. 1890, at three o'clock, in special session.

The following entitled ordinances (passed by the Common Council,) were read the first time :

Ap. O. 18, 1890—An ordinance appropriating eight hundred and forty (\$840.00) dollars with which to pay the semi-annual interest on certain city bonds.

Ap. O. 19, 1890—An ordinance appropriating eighty-seven thousand (\$87,000.00) dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary to pay all outstanding temporary loans of the city.
