REPORTS FROM STANDING COMMITTEES.

From the Committee on Public Service:

INDIANAPOLIS, IND., May 18, 1910.

To the President and Members of the Common Council:

GENTLEMEN: We, your Committee on Public Service, to whom was referred General Ordinance No. 30, 1910, being "An ordinance ratifying, confirming and approving a certain contract and agreement made and entered into on the 16th day of May, 1910, between the City of Indianapolis, by and through its Board of Public Works, and the Indianapolis, Newcastle and Toledo Electric Railway Company, whereby said company is authorized to run and operate its interurban cars into said city, and to carry passengers, mail, express matter, baggage and freight on such cars, in and upon the streets of the City of Indianapolis, and granting it permission to cross certain streets and alleys in said city, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect," beg leave to report that we have had said ordinance under consideration and would recommend that the same do pass.
