DEAR SIR: In our letter to you of September 23, 1910, asking for an appropriation of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00) for the Street Cleaning Department, we mentioned as the title of the fund "Sweeping and Cleaning Streets and Alleys Accounts Fund" instead of "Sweeping and Cleaning Streets and Alleys Salaries and Wages Fund." For that reason the ordinance which was introduced in the Council is wrong.

We now recommend that you submit to the Common Council as soon as possible an ordinance appropriating the sum of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00) to the "Sweeping and Cleaning Streets and Alleys Salaries and Wages Fund," to take the place of the one heretofore referred to.

INTRODUCTION OF APPROPRIATION ORDINANCES.

By City Controller:

Appropriation Ordinance No. 61—1910: An ordinance providing for the appropriation of \$600.00 to and for the use of the Department of Public Works, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, That the sum of six hundred dollars (\$600.00), or so much of said sum as may be necessary, be and is hereby appropriated

out of any moneys in the city treasury not otherwise appropriated, to and for the use of the Department of Public Works, the sum herein appropriated to be used for the purpose of paying for the construction of cement walks in Locke street along the City Hospital property.

SEC. 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Which was read a first time and referred to the Committee on Finance.

From City Controller:

Appropriation Ordinance No. 62—1910: An ordinance providing for the appropriation of \$10,000 to and for the use of the Department of Public Works, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, That the sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) be and is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the city treasury not otherwise appropriated, to and for the use of the Department of Public Works, the sum herein appropriated to be added to and form a part of the regular appropriation known as "Sweeping and Cleaning Streets and Alleys Salaries and Wages."

SEC. 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Which was read a first time.

Mr. Owen moved that the rules be suspended and Appropriation Ordinance No. 62, 1910, be placed upon its passage.

The roll was called and the motion to suspend the rules carried by the following vote:
