WHEREAS, certain extraordinary conditions have developed since the adoption of the existing annual budget, and certain monies appropriated for certain accounts of the Department of Public Works are insufficient to meet current needs of the Department, and

WHEREAS, certain existing appropriations for said department now have unobligated balances which will not be needed for the purpose for which appropriated.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA

Section 1. That a certain item and fund specifically budgeted in the Department of Public Works, Administration, be and the same is hereby reduced in the following amount, to-wit:

Section 2. The above transfer and reappropriation is necessary because of an existing emergency, in that a need has arisen requiring the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars in repairs to be made on the Police Cycle Garage, the full extent of said need was not foreseen at the time of proposing the 1962 Budget, because there has arisen an unusual requirement for more repairs and supplies. There are sufficient funds by virtue of the above reduction to meet this appropriation and said appropriation will not result in any increase in the total budget.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

Section 1. That the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00), contributed to City Civil Defense by the County Council, be budgeted to the following fund:

WHEREAS, the Board of Public Safety of the City of Indianapolis, has heretofore been granted a proposition for the purchase of

said real estate for the sum of Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$7,500.00), and

WHEREAS, the Board of Public Safety of the City of Indianapolis, has heretofore obtained an appraisal for said real estate from competent, disinterested appraisers at a cash value of Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$7,500.00), and

WHEREAS, the Board of Public Safety of the City of Indianapolis has determined that it would be in the best interest and for the benefit of the City of Indianapolis and its Fire Department, to acquire said real estate for a new fire station and that it has sufficient funds on hand for said purchase.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That the Board of Public Safety of the City of Indianapolis, through its duly authorized Purchasing Agent, is hereby authorized, directed, and empowered to purchase the following described real estate for the sum of Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$7,500.00), the sum of the appraised value, to-wit:

A part of the west half of the northeast quarter of Section 24, Township 16 North of Range 2 East in Marion County, Indiana, being more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a point in the east line of the said half quarter section a distance of 180.00 feet north of the southeast corner thereof; running thence south 89 degrees 47 minutes 25 seconds west upon and along a line parallel to the south line of the said half quarter section a distance of 180.00 feet to a point; running thence north 00 degrees 00 minutes 00 seconds and parallel with the east line of the said half quarter section a distance of 110.00 feet to a point; running thence north 89 degrees 47 minutes 25 seconds east and parallel with the south line of the said half quarter section a distance of 180.00 feet to a point on the east line of the said half quarter section; running thence south 00 degrees 00 minutes 00 seconds upon and along the east line of the said half quarter section a distance of 110.00 feet to the place of beginning, containing, 0.455 acres more or less.

Subject, however, to a 45 foot right of way by parallel lines off the entire east side for Moller Road.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor and compliance with all laws pertaining thereto.
