APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE NO. 11, 1962

An Ordinance transferring the amount of One Hundred Dollars

(\$100.00) within the department of the Personnel Consultant, thereby transferring \$100.00 from Fund 26 "Other Contractual" to Fund 36, "Office Supplies".

APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE NO. 12, 1962

INTRODUCTION OF GENERAL ORDINANCES

By Councilman Huber:

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 91, 1962

AN ORDINANCE establishing a certain passenger and/or loading

zone in the City of Indianapolis, pursuant to the provisions of the Municipal Code of Indianapolis, 1951, General Ordinance No. 140, 1951, as amended, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL
OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That for the purpose of providing the owners or occupants of certain premises fronting on certain streets in the City of Indianapolis, with ingress and egress for passengers, materials and merchandise coming to or going from such premises, such owners or occupants having complied with the provisions of the Municipal Code of Indianapolis, 1951, General Ordinance No. 140, 1951, as amended, Section 4-1001, and the Board of Public Safety, after due investigation, having recommended the establishment of the same, the following passenger and/or loading zone be and the same is, hereby established in the City of Indianapolis, to-wit:

Beginning at a point in the Southeasterly curb line of Kentucky Ave. 158 feet northeast of the intersecting north curb line of west Maryland Street, as presently established, and extending Northeasterly a distance of 50 feet, for the use and occupancy of Hertz Rent-A-Car Service, 39 & 41 Kentucky Avenue.

Section 2. That said loading zone is hereby declared to be subject to all existing traffic and parking regulations, and to any later ordinances and regulations as may be applicable.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor and compliance with all laws pertaining thereto.

Which was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Elections.

AN ORDINANCE to amend the Municipal Code of Indianapolis, 1951,

General Ordinance No. 140, 1951, as amended and more particularly Title 4, Chapter 6 thereof, by the deletion and repeal of certain subsections to Section 4-602, prescribing one-way vehicular traffic, and fixing a time when said amendment, deletion and repeal shall take effect.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That Title 4, Chapter 6, Section 4-602 of the Municipal Code of Indianapolis, 1951, General Ordinance No. 140, 1951, as amended, be amended by the deletion and repeal thereof of the following subsections, as follows:

140	Birch Avenue	Henry Street	Oliver Avenue	North
142	Drover Street	Oliver Avenue	Henry Street	South

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor, compliance with all laws pertaining thereto and publication as required by law.

Section 2. This amendment shall be subject to the penalties as provided in Title 1, Chapter 6, Section 1-601 of the Municipal Code of Indianapolis, Indiana, 1951, as amended.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor, compliance with all laws pertaining thereto and publication as required by law.

Which was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Public Works.
