Nov 18, 1851

Council met. Present Messrs. Buchanan, Pitts, Louden, Edwards and Mr. Culley President.

Minutes of preceding meeting read and approved.

The Street Commissioner offered the following report:

"To the City Council:

Your Street Commissioner respectfully reports that he notified the property-holders along North side of Washington street between Pennsylvania and Meridian Street, of the order of the City Council, to repave and regrade sidewalk within thirty days, on the 15th day of October 1851.

But being informed by the Councilman of Third Ward that it was unnecessary to give notice between Meridian and Illinois street, because the property holders had contracted for repaving and regrading, and that notices would be superfluous.

I gave the notice required on last Wednesday, the 12th inst as required by your order"

"An Ordinance authorizing the Lafayette and Indianapolis Railroad Company to construct a track through the city of Indianapolis, and prescribing the terms thereof".
