

City Council Chamber
August 7, 1852

Council assembled. Present Messrs Delzell, Buchanan, Fidler, Pitts & Culley

John S. Allen, Assessor presented assessment roll for the year 1852,

The Council, on Motion proceeded to levy the amount of taxes for the current year upon the taxable property of the city as follows:

- For General purposes, 15 cents on the \$100
- For School purposes, $12\frac{1}{2}$ cents on the \$100
- For Fire Engine purposes 5 cents on the \$100
- For Town Clock & Bell 2 cents on the \$100
- For polls on every person subject to pay poll tax \$1.--
- For Road purposes on every person subject to pay Road tax \$1.

Mr. Fidler moved that \$2 be levied on all dogs;
which Motion did not prevail

Mr. Delzell moved that \$1 be levied on all dogs;
which Motion did not prevail

The Council appointed Monday the 14 instant for the hearing and determining all appeals from assessment.
