

City Council Chamber  
December 10, 1852

Council met pursuant to adjournment. Present Messrs Louden, Delzell, Buchanan, Fidler, Greer, Pitts, & Culley, President.

The President announced the order of business to be the reception of a report from the Fire Department Committee relative to ordinance referred to them at last meeting:

Mr. Buchanan, Chairman of the Committee on the Fire Department, made the following report:

"The Committee on the Fire Department to whom was referred an ordinance relative to the Fire Association of Indianapolis respectfully return the same without amendment and recommend its passage."

The ordinance after being read Section by Section, was unanimously adopted.

Mr. Berry R. Sulgrove, a committee of one, on the part of the Marion Fire Company, appeared and read a petition of said company praying that the Council pay their Secretary a yearly compensation.

Resolved That the City Attorney inquire into and by what authority the Plank Roads Company claims Washington Street from the East line to the River, and report the same at the next regular meeting of the Council". Adopted.

Mr. Delzell in behalf of the Invincible Fire Co. No. 2 petitioned the Council for an appropriation of an amount sufficient to planks & studding to build a temporary Engine House. Referred to the Committee on the Fire Department.

The Council adjourned to meet again on Monday evening next.
