

PROCEEDINGS OF COMMON COUNCIL.

SPECIAL SESSION—MARCH 21, 1889.

The Common Council of the City of Indianapolis, met in the Council Chamber, Thursday evening, March 21st, A. D. 1889, at eight o'clock, in special session, pursuant to the following call :

Indianapolis, March 21, 1889.

TO CALEB S. DENNY, Mayor of the City of Indianapolis :

We, the undersigned, members of the Common Council, request that a meeting of the Common Council be held this, Thursday evening, March 21st, 1889, for the purpose of repealing or amending G. O. No. 19, 1887, and G. O. 34, of 1888, which ordinances and amendments are in reference to the construction of certain street railway lines in the city.

PRESENT—Hon. Caleb S. Denny, Mayor, and *ex officio* President of the Common Council, in the Chair, and 19 members, viz: Councilmen Burns, Cummings, Darnell, Davis, Dunn, Elliott, Gasper, Gaul, Johnston, Long, Markey, McClelland, O'Connor, Parkinson, Pearson, Smith, Swain, Thalman, and Trusler.

Councilman Pearson introduced the following entitled ordinance, which was read the first time :

G. O. 8, 1889—An ordinance to amend Section one of an ordinance entitled "An ordinance authorizing the construction, extension and operation of certain street railways in and upon the streets of the City of Indianapolis;" ordained June 22d, 1887.

On motion by Councilman Pearson, the rules were suspended for the purpose of placing the above entitled ordinance on its final passage, by the following vote :

The ordinance—G. O. 8, 1889—was then read the second time, ordered engrossed, and read the third time.

And it was passed by the following vote :

NAYS—None.


On motion, the Common Council then adjourned, at 9:00 o'clock, P. M.
