

The Marshal reported the payment into the Treasury of \$29.63 as the net proceeds of the hogs & pigs impounded by him during last year.


Resolutions offered

Resolved That the City Marshal be required to prohibit any person from digging or removing sand or gravel from the river bank, west of the old grave Yard, and that he be required to set up a notice of this



resolution at the place where the gravel is taken from, and other public places in the City.

By Mr Louden

Resolved, That the Sexton be and he is hereby requested to keep an account of the number of persons buried each week, the name, and age of each, disease, if known, and report the same to the secretary of the Council, whose duty it shall be to have the same published in two of the public newspapers, and keep a register in a book prepared for that purpose.

Resolved, That there be appropriated the sum of fifty dollars to each ward for the purpose of removing Standing water in mud holes throughout the City. Laid on table.
