DEAR SIR: Having had submitted to us for examination General Ordinance No. 33, 1913, concerning the regulation of privies, together with the committee's report thereon, kindly be advised that we have examined the same, and it is our opinion that all of the sections of the original ordinance, and all of the amendments proposed by the report of the committee are valid provisions, and within the powers granted to the Council by the Legislature, except so much of Section 3 of the original ordinance which provides that the cost shall become a lien upon the property. The city would probably have the right to make the cost collectible against the party by suit, but would have no right to arbitrarily declare it a lien and proceed after notice with the necessary construction.

I would suggest that the title of Ordinance No. 33, 1913, should be amended simply to show An Ordinance Regulating Privies, which without

a repealing clause would be treated as a supplemental ordinance. It is doubtful whether it adds any strength to the ordinance to call it a supplemental ordinance, but it would not affect the validity of the ordinance, but would only result in possible confusion. On the other hand, there are so many defunct ordinances with reference to privies and vaults that it might be well to insert a repealing clause, repealing all ordinances in conflict with this ordinance.
