INTRODUCTION OF APPROPRIATION ORDINANCES.

By City Controller:

Appropriation Ordinance No. 61—1913: An ordinance appropriating the sum of \$3,300.00 to and for the use of the Department of Public Safety and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, that the sum of three thousand three hundred (\$3,300.00) dollars be, and is hereby appropriated out of any money in the City Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to and for the use of the Department of Public Safety, the amount appropriated herein to be added to and form a part of the fund known as "Emergency Police."

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, that the sum of one hundred fifty (\$150.00) dollars be and is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the City Treasury not otherwise appropriated to and for the use of the Department of Finance, the amount appropriated herein to be added to and form a part of the fund known as "Miscellaneous Expense, City Offices."

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
