ADJOURNED SESSION.

CHAMBER OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS,
SATURDAY, MARCH 21ST, 1868, 7 O'CLOCK, P. M. }

The Common Council met pursuant to adjournment:

Present—His Honor, the Mayor, Daniel Macauley, in the chair,
and the following members:

Councilmen Brown, Coburn, Cottrell, Davis, Foster, Geisel, Henschen, Jameson, Kappes, Loomis, MacArthur, Seidensticker, Stanton and Woodburn—14.

Absent—Councilmen Burgess, Colley, Goddard and Schmidt—4.

His Honor, the Mayor, announced the special order of business to be the consideration of the ordinance accepting the Fletcher Park.

Mr. Brown moved that the ordinance be engrossed.

The Council being but sparsely represented, it was agreed to suspend the special order until 8 o'clock.

By unanimous consent, Dr. Jameson offered the following motion:

That the Treasurer be directed to pay the six per cent. three years six per cent. War Bonds, provided the holders deduct interest from the time of payment to the time of maturity.

Which was adopted.

At 8 o'clock the special order was resumed.

Dr. Jameson offered the following amendment :

In section 2 strike out "forever," and insert "for the term of forty years, after which said property shall belong to the city in fee simple."

The question being on the adoption of the amendment, the ayes and noes were called.

Those who voted in the affirmative were Councilmen Coburn, Henschen, Jameson and Woodburn—4.

Those who voted in the negative were Councilmen Brown, Cottrell, Davis, Foster, Geisel, Kappes, MacArthur, Seidensticker and Stanton—9.

So the amendment was lost.

After a lengthy debate, in which all the members more or less participated, the ayes and noes were demanded on the motion to order the ordinance engrossed.

The question being, shall the ordinance be engrossed? those who voted in the affirmative were Councilmen Brown, Coburn, Geisel, Loomis and Seidensticker—5.

Those who voted in the negative were Councilmen Cottrell, Davis, Foster, Henschen, Jameson, Kappes, MacArthur, Stanton and Woodburn—9.

So the motion to engross was lost.

On motion the Council adjourned.
