I move to amend Section 1 of General Ordinance No. 5, 1942, by substituting for sub-section No. 12 therein, the following:

- (12) Within twenty-five (25) feet of the nearest rail, which said operator is then and there approaching, of any railroad at any grade crossing, or any railroad overhead structure.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Ropkey and passed by the following roll call vote:

On motion of Mr. Wood, seconded by Mr. Bach, General Ordinance No. 5, 1942, as amended, was ordered engrossed, read a third time and placed upon its passage.

General Ordinance No. 5, 1942, as amended, was read a third time by the Clerk and passed by the following roll call vote:

General Ordinance No. 7, 1942, General Ordinance No. 8, 1942, and General Ordinance No. 9, 1942, were held for

further consideration by the Committees to which they were referred.

On motion of Dr. Hemphill, seconded by Mr. Bach, the Common Council adjourned at 10:15 p. m.
