AN ORDINANCE prohibiting parking on certain parts of certain streets of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana; providing a penalty for the violation thereof, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for the operator of any vehicle to park the same, or suffer, permit or allow the same to be parked at any time upon certain streets in the City of Indianapolis described as follows, to-wit:

- (a) On the southwest side of Belt Street, beginning at the southeast curb line of Nordyke Avenue to the southeast curb line of Silver Avenue.
- (b) On the southeast side of Nordyke Avenue, beginning from the southwest curb line of Stock Street to the southwest curb line of Belt Street.

Section 2. Any person violating any provision of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined in any sum not exceeding Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00), to which may be added imprisonment not exceeding one hundred eighty (180) days.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor, and publication according to law.


