GENERAL ORDINANCE No. 77, 1943

AN ORDINANCE amending paragraph numbered fourteen (14) of Section 467 in General Ordinance No. 121, 1925, commonly known as the "Municipal Code of Indianapolis, 1925"; and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

GENERAL ORDINANCE No. 86, 1943

AN ORDINANCE prohibiting parking on certain parts of certain designated streets in the City of Indianapolis, Indiana; providing a penalty for violation thereof, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

GENERAL ORDINANCE No. 87, 1943 (As Amended)

AN ORDINANCE repealing General Ordinance No. 20, 1942, regarding parking on the west side of Oriental Street, from Washington Street to the Pennsylvania Railway right-of-way; and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

GENERAL ORDINANCE No. 88, 1943

AN ORDINANCE approving an order of the Board of Public Safety of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, to establish a taxi-cab stand on West North Street in said City, pursuant to Section 9 of General Ordinance No. 87, 1935, as amended; and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

GENERAL ORDINANCE No. 89, 1943

AN ORDINANCE regulating parking on certain parts of certain streets in the City of Indianapolis, Indiana; providing a penalty for violation thereof; and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

GENERAL ORDINANCE No. 91, 1943

AN ORDINANCE prohibiting persons under Fifteen (15) years of age to be on the streets, etc., of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, during the night time and prescribing for the violation thereof and repealing all ordinances in conflict therewith.

APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE No. 80, 1943

AN ORDINANCE appropriating the sum of Four Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$450.00) from the anticipated, estimated, and unappropriated 1943 balance of the General Fund of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, to Fund No. 25, Repairs, Street Commissioner, in the Department of Public Works of said city; and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE No. 81, 1943

AN ORDINANCE transferring the sum of Sixty-Five Dollars (\$65.00) from Fund No. 34, Institutional and Medical, Public Buildings in the Department of Public Works of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, according to the 1943 Budget Classifications, to Fund No. 32, Fuel and Ice, of the same Department; and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

RESOLUTION No. 15, 1943

WHEREAS, COLONEL HARVEY WEIR COOK, a public spirited resident of this City, gave his life in defense of his country, having died in an airplane crash in the South Pacific on March 21, 1943; and,

AN ORDINANCE appropriating the total sum of Two Thousand Five Hundred and Sixty Dollars (\$2,560.00) from the estimated, anticipated and unappropriated 1944 balance of the General Fund of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, as of February 1, 1944, and allocating same among certain designated funds in the Assessment Bureau division of the Department of Public

Works, according to 1944 Budget Classifications, for the purpose of creating and providing for certain additional services and supplies, beginning as of February 1, 1944; and fixing a time when this ordinance shall take effect.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That the total sum of Two Thousand Five Hundred and Sixty Dollars (\$2,560.00) be and the same is hereby appropriated, as of February 1, 1944, from the estimated, anticipated and unappropriated 1944 balance of the General Fund of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, and allocated in the respective amounts hereinafter set out to the respective funds indicated in the Assessment Bureau division under the Department of Public Works, according to 1944 Budget Classifications, for the respective additional services and supplies hereby created and provided for, beginning as of February 1, 1944, to-wit:

AN ORDINANCE providing for certain additional items in certain funds of the 1944 Budget for the Division of City Civil Engineer, Department of Public Works of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, as shown by General Ordinance No. 62, 1943; appropriating the necessary total amount of Four Thousand, Eight Hundred Seventy-Seven Dollars (\$4,877.00), therefore, as of January 1, 1944, by transferring, re-appropriating and reallocating thereto a part thereof as of January 1, 1944, from monies already provided in said budget for a certain other item in Fund No. 11-8 of said division and department, and by providing the balance of Three Thousand, Two Hundred Ninety-Nine Dollars and Thirty Cents; therefore by appropriating same, as of January 1, 1944, from the estimated, anticipated and unappropriated 1944 balance of the Gas Tax Fund of said City; and fixing a time when this ordinance shall take effect.


