INTRODUCTION OF GENERAL ORDINANCES

By the Board of Public Safety:

GENERAL ORDINANCE No. 72, 1944

AN ORDINANCE regulating parking on a certain part of East 19th Street in the City of Indianapolis, Indiana; Providing a penalty for the violation thereof; amending Section 44 of General Ordinance No. 96, 1928, as amended, to make Arsenal Avenue a preferential street over Market Street at the intersection thereof; Repealing all and/or parts only of ordinances in conflict herewith; and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for the operator of any vehicle to park same or suffer, permit or allow the same to be parked at any time upon the following designated part of East 19th Street in the City of Indianapolis, to-wit:

"Prohibiting parking at all times on the south side of East 19th Street from the west curb line of Cornell Avenue west to the east curb line of the first alley running south from 19th Street."

Section 2. Any persons violating any provision of Section 1 of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined in any sum not exceeding Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00), to which may be added imprisonment not exceeding one hundred eighty (180) days.

Section 3. That section 44 of General Ordinance No. 96, 1928, as amended, of said City be and the same is hereby amended to make the following part of Arsenal Avenue preferential, to-wit:

Arsenal Avenue, at its intersection with Market Street.

Section 4. That all and/or any part only of existing ordinances in conflict with Section 3 hereof are repealed only insofar as the same are conflicting therewith, including that ordinance heretofore enacted and now existing which preferred Market Street over Arsenal Avenue at the intersection thereof.

Section 5. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor, and compliance with all law pertaining thereto.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Law and Judiciary.

By Councilman Jordan:

GENERAL ORDINANCE No. 73, 1944

AN ORDINANCE providing for the purchase and supply of personal equipment, such as uniforms, supplies, etc., beginning as of January 1, 1945, in a yearly amount of not to exceed Sixty Dollars (\$60.00) per member per annum for each member in the

Indianapolis Police and Fire Departments, including those members attached to and/or serving with the Gamewell Division: Providing for the payment of said allowances on the Fifteenth (15th) day of February, 1945, by the City Controller of the City of Indianapolis and fixing a time when this ordinance shall take effect.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That beginning as of January 1, 1945, the City Controller of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, be and the same is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to pay the annual sum of Sixty Dollars (\$60.00) in one annual allowance, as uniform, clothing and equipment allowances from the special fund known as "Police and Firemen's Equipment Fund," to each and every member of the Indianapolis Police and Fire Department (including such members as are attached to or serving with the Gamewell Division as well as policewomen and plain-clothes detectives) who has been a member for the last past twelve (12) months or longer.

Section 2. That the said annual payment of Sixty Dollars (\$60.00) above provided for shall be made on the Fifteenth (15th) day of February, 1945.

Section 3. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage, approval by the Mayor and compliance with all laws pertaining thereto.

Which was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Parks.

SPECIAL ORDINANCE No. 1, 1944

AN ORDINANCE changing the name of a certain street within the City of Indianapolis, Indiana; and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

Section 1. That the street known and designated as Waterman Place, running east and west from Clarendon Road to Crown, shall be henceforth known and designated as Clarendon Place.

Appropriation Ordinance No. 87, 1944, was read a third time by the Clerk and passed by the following roll call vote:

Mr. Brown called for General Ordinance No. 60, 1944, for second reading. It was read a second time.

Mr. Brown presented the following written motion to amend General Ordinance No. 60, 1944:

Indianapolis, Ind., October 2, 1944.

Mr. President:

I move that General Ordinance No. 60, 1944, be amended to read as follows:

GENERAL ORDINANCE No. 60, 1944 (As Amended)

AN ORDINANCE requiring confidential written reports to be filed with the Accident Prevention Division of the Indianapolis Police Department in all motor vehicle, trolley and street car accidents wherein death, personal injury, or property damage to the amount of Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) or more, result; Providing a penalty for violation thereof; and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That any operator of any motor vehicle, trolley or street car, which is involved in an accident wherein death, personal injury or property damage to the amount of Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) or more result, be and the same is hereby required to file a written report of such accident with the Accident Prevention Division of the Police Department of the City of Indianapolis within 48 hours thereafter.

Section 2. Such report shall include the name and address of the operator, the time, date, and location of the accident, such other information as may, from time to time be prescribed by said department for the purposes of accident prevention, and shall be for the confidential use of such department or other agencies having use of same for the purposes of accident prevention, exxcepting that the

department may disclose the identity of a person involved in an accident when such identity is not otherwise known, or when such person denies his presence at such accident, and, upon demand of any court or by any person who has, or claims to have, made such a report, such Department shall furnish a certificate showing that a specified accident report has, or has not been made, solely for the purpose of

proving compliance or non-compliance with the requirements of this ordinance. No such report shall be used as evidence in any trial, civil or criminal, arising out of such accident.

Section 3. Any person violating any provision of this ordinance, upon conviction, shall be fined in any sum not less than Five Dollars (\$5.00) and not exceeding One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00).

Section 4. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval by the Mayor, and publication according to law.

General Ordinance No. 70, 1944, was read a third time by the Clerk and passed by the following roll call vote:

MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS

Mr. Bowers nominated President Schumacher to represent the Council on the Board of Directors of the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra. Which was seconded by Mr. Worley and President Schumacher was unanimously elected to serve in this capacity.


