Persons holding part-time, seasonal, work-study, interns, or temporary or emergency employment (such as jurors, witnesses, interns, work-study and EEA positions) as well as those employed on a fee basis. or in experimental programs temporarily funded by specific federal or state government grants are not included as eligible employees."

Section 2. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption.

To provide for expenditures the necessity for which has arisen since the adoption of the annual budget, the CITY-COUNTY ANNUAL BUDGET FOR 1974, as amended, is hereby further amended by the increases and reductions hereinafter stated to provide for the reconstruction of the sewage plant at the Marion County Home.

CITY-COUNTY GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 28, 1974

A GENERAL ORDINANCE amending Title 1, Chapter 5 of the Code of Indianapolis and Marion County, 1970, defining the boundaries of the Councilmanic Districts and describing Twenty-five (25) City-County Councilmanic Electoral Districts pursuant to the requirements of, and authority granted by, I.C. 1971, 18-4-3-8, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY-COUNTY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS AND OF MARION COUNTY, INDIANA:

Section 1. Title 1, Chapter 5 of the Code of Indianapolis and Marion County, Indiana, 1970, is hereby amended to read as follows:

CHAPTER 5 City-County Councilmanic Districts

1-501. Councilmanic Districts.

The City of Indianapolis and Marion County, Indiana, are hereby divided into twenty-five (25) single member City-County Council Electoral Districts, each of which is described in the following sections of this Chapter 5.

In the event that there is any discrepancy between the census definitions and the geographic boundaries of any of the councilmanic districts provided by Sections 1-502 through 1-526 (inclusive), the sections shall be construed as to include all territory in Marion County within one, and only one, of the twenty-five (25) districts and to such end the geographic boundaries shall be construed to prevail over census definitions.

It shall be unlawful for any person conducting or assisting in the conduct of a funeral procession to fail to observe all traffic regulations or to cause other lawful traffic to stop for a funeral procession unless the funeral procession contains a vehicle carrying the remains of the deceased.

Section 2. Any person violating this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be subject to fine or imprisonment, or both, the fine not to exceed Five hundred (\$500.00) and the imprisonment not to be more than six (6) months.
