APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE No. 22, 1934

AN ORDINANCE appropriating Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) out of the anticipated undistributed and unappropriated balance of the Gasoline Tax receipts for the year 1934, transferring the same to Park Board Gasoline Tax Fund No. 12-1, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

SPECIAL ORDINANCE No. 1, 1934

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the sale, alienation and conveyance of certain "park land" of the City of Indianapolis,

GENERAL ORDINANCE No. 30, 1934

INTRODUCTION OF APPROPRIATION ORDINANCES

APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE No. 24, 1934

AN ORDINANCE appropriating the sum of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) from the unappropriated and unexpended balance of the Municipal Airport Fund for the year 1933 and transferring the same to Municipal Airport Fund No. 25—Repairs, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS:

SECTION 1. That the sum of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) now unappropriated and unexpended in the Municipal Airport Fund for the year 1933, be and the same is hereby appropriated and transferred therefrom to Municipal Airport Fund No. 25—Repairs.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the mayor and publication according to law.

APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE No. 25, 1934

AN ORDINANCE appropriating an unexpended and heretofore unappropriated sum of Eighteen Hundred and Seventy-five (\$1,875.00) Dollars now in the Board of Health General Fund to City Hospital General Fund No. 721, Furniture and Fixtures, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

WHEREAS, the Board of Health of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana, by its Resolution No. 32, 1934, duly adopted by said Board at a regular meeting held on the 18th day of May, 1934, authorized the following appropriation of funds of said Department, received by gift, and now unexpended and heretofore unappropriated,

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. That the sum of Eighteen Hundred and Seventy-five (\$1,875.00) Dollars received by gift, unexpended and heretofore unappropriated and now in the Board of Health General Fund be and the same is hereby appropriated and transferred to City Hospital General Fund No. 721 for furniture and fixtures.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its publication, passage and approval by the Mayor.

INTRODUCTION OF GENERAL ORDINANCES

GENERAL ORDINANCE No. 36, 1934

AN ORDINANCE transferring moneys from certain funds and re-appropriating the same to other designated funds, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. That the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) now in Department of Public Works, Municipal Garage Fund No. 11—Salaries and Wages, Regular, be and the same is hereby transferred therefrom and reappropriated to Department of Public Works, Municipal Garage Fund No. 12—Salaries and Wages, Temporary.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor and publication according to law.

Which was read a first time and referred to the Committee on Finance.

By Board of Public Safety:

GENERAL ORDINANCE No. 37, 1934

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the purchase of six (6) motorcycles and three (3) sidecars by the Board of Public Safety for use of the Police Department of the City of Indianapolis, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. That the Board of Public Safety of the City of Indianapolis be and it is hereby authorized to purchase six (6) four (4) cylinder motorcycles and three (3) sidecars for the use of the Indianapolis Police Department.

SECTION 2. That said purchase be made of Roland Free, agent of the Indian Motorcycle Company, said Roland Free having been the lowest and best bidder under competitive bidding ac-

ording to law, for the total amount of Three Thousand One Hundred Sixty-four Dollars (\$3,164.00).

SECTION 3. That the purchase price for said motorcycles and side-cars be paid out of the fund heretofore appropriated to said Board of Public Safety for the year 1934.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor and publication according to law.

Which was read a first time and referred to the Committee on Finance.

By Mr. Morgan:

GENERAL ORDINANCE No. 38, 1934

AN ORDINANCE LICENSING AND REGULATING THE BUSINESS OF WRECKING HOUSES, BUILDINGS AND OTHER STRUCTURES, PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE, AND FIXING A TIME WHEN THE SAME SHALL TAKE EFFECT.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation or association to conduct, maintain or engage in the business to, or to contract to, wreck, raze or demolish houses, buildings or other structures in the City of Indianapolis, without first having been duly licensed so to do, as hereinafter provided. Every applicant for a license shall make application in writing to the City Controller, which application shall set forth the name under which the business is to be conducted, and the name of every person interested in said business. Said application shall contain the names of at least two citizens of the City of Indianapolis, who are freeholders, as to the character of the applicant or applicants.

SECTION 2. Licenses for the carrying on of said business shall be issued annually and shall expire on the 31st day of December of each year; shall not be transferable and no deductions shall be allowed from the fee for such license for any part of the year during which the licensee shall not exercise the right of such license. The license fee for carrying on said business, as aforesaid, shall be \$50.00 per annum.

SECTION 3. Said license shall not be issued unless the applicant or applicants shall have first filed a certificate with the City Controller certifying that said applicant or applicants have secured the payment of compensation to all employees of the applicants by insuring the liability of said applicant or applicants to make payment of compensation for injuries occurring out of and in course of the employment, with a responsible insurance company approved by the City Controller.

SECTION 4. Any person, firm, corporation or association violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall on conviction, be fined in any sum not exceeding Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00), to which may be added imprisonment for any period not exceeding six (6) months.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor, and publication according to law.

Which was read a first time and referred to the Committee on Finance.

ORDINANCES ON SECOND READING

Mr. Houck called for General Ordinance No. 35, 1934, for second reading. It was read a second time.

On motion of Mr. Houck, seconded by Mr. Wheatley, General Ordinance No. 35, 1934, was ordered engrossed, read a third time and placed upon its passage.


General Ordinance No. 35, 1934 was read a third time by the Clerk and passed by the following roll call vote:

On motion of Mr. Henry, seconded by Mr. Wheatley, the Common Council adjourned at 8:00 p. m.


