It will therefore be necessary to transfer \$700.00 from Fund 73—(appropriation for purchase of park) into Fund No. 53—Refunds, Awards and Indemnities. \$1,300.00will be paid from the balance now in Fund No. 53 and the balance will have to be transferred.

AN ORDINANCE establishing a certain passenger and/or loading zone in the City of Indianapolis, pursuant to the provisions of Section 26 of General Ordinance No. 96, 1928, as amended by General Ordinance No. 31, 1931, as amended by General Ordinance No. 58, 1931, and fixing a time when the same shall take effect.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA:

Section 1. That for the purpose of providing the owners or occupants of certain premises fronting on certain public streets in the City of Indianapolis with ingress and egress for passengers, materials and merchandise coming to or going from such premises, such owner or occupants having complied with the provisions of Section 23 of General Ordinance No. 96, 1928, as amended by General Ordinance No. 31, 1931, as amended by General Ordinance No. 58, 1931, relative to the establishment of passenger and/or loading zones, at the place hereinafter set out, and the Board of Public Safety having caused investigation to be made thereof and having recommended the establishment, pursuant to the terms of the aforesaid ordinances, the following passenger and/or loading zone be and the same is hereby established in the City of Indianapolis, to-wit:

18 feet on Ohio Street, at the southeast corner of Ohio and Pennsylvania Streets, in front of the Denison Shop.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.
