## COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE MAYOR

City of Indianapolis, August 21, 1920.
To the President and Members of the Common Council of the City of Indianapolis, Indiana:

Gentlemen-I herewith present to you a report prepared by Robert H. Bryson, City Controller, addressed to me showing the various estimated amounts required in such controller's opinion for each executive department, and for other city expenses of the city government for the fiscal year begimning January 1, 1921, together with the estimated expenditures for the year 1921, submitted by the various departments of the city.

The estimates of the amounts of money required for each of the executive departments for the ensuing fiscal year are stated and made with as great particularity as possible.

Said report of the controller also contains an estimate of the necessary per cent. of taxes to be levied for general purposes for the city and for each executive department or fund for which a separate levy is authorized by law.

In my communication to the Common Council under date of August :30, 1919 , submitting estimates for the year $\mathbf{1 9 2 0}$, it was shown that during the years 1917,1918 and 1919 there was a total loss of revenues on account of money formerly received from liquor licenses and fran(hise tax of Six Hundred and Sixty-six Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty-nine Dollars and Fifty-five Cents $(\$ 666,789.55)$, and that the necessary increases in salary of the police and fire departments for the years 1918 and 1919 was Two Hundred and Sixty-two thousand Five Hundred and Sixty-two Dollars and Ninety Cents ( $\$ 262,562.90$ ), and that during these years the city was compelled to pay a surcharge of Eighty-nine Thousand Six Hundred and Twenty-three Dollars and Thirty-four Cents ( $\$ 80,623.34$ ), on account of its public utility contracts. which was occasioned by war conditions, making a total amount of increase in salaries in the fire and police department, surcharge on utility contracts, and loss of revenues of the sum of One Million, Nine Thousand. Nine Hundred and Seventy-five Dollars and Seventynine Cents $(\$ 1,009,975.79)$. That the apparent deficit of One Million, Nine Thousand, Nine Hundred and Seventy-five Dollars and Seventynine Cents $(\$ 1,009,979.79)$ had, by careful administration and strict
aronomy in every department, bern reduced to an actual deficit of atr proximately Fight Hundred Thousand Dollars $\$(800,000.00)$.

The Legislature of 191!), by sluecial act, gave the City of Indianapolis the authority to levy a fifteen cont (\$.5) tax on all taxable moperty for each of the years of $1!119$ and 1920 for the purpose of soming revenucs sufficient to pis the ileficit accumulated on accome of loss of revemes and incte...ed costs; and a silecial lery of Nine ('ents ( $\$ .09$ ) on each One Hundred Dollars $\$ 100.00$ ) was made for the rear 1919, with the intention of making an additional ley of
 amd disclarge sucli deficit.

The rates for gemeral (ity purposes for the year 191!) and all Alecial rates and levies, were baseal on the total aggregate valuation of all property in the City of Indiampolis for taxation for the year 1:19) of Six Hundred and Ninety Nillion Dollars, which, as is well known, was erroneous, the real valuation of all properts in the (ity of Indianapolis for taxation in the year 1919 being only Five Hundred and Ninety-three Million, Fise Hindred and Twelve Thousard. Five Hundred and Fifty Dollars ( $\$ .593,512,550$ ), or a difference of Ninety-six Million, Four Hundred amb Eighty-seven Thous:mut, Fomr
 (ieneral Find and all special levies lost the revenne in the rear 1!19) on Ninety-six Million. Four Hundred and Eighty-seren Thousitnd. Four Hundrell and Fifty Dollars ( $\$ 96,487,4.50$ ), which on the Nine Cent ( $\$ .09$ ) lery and on the Forty-two Cent ( $\$ .42$ ) levy for genaral purposes alone amomed to Four Hundred and Ninety-three Thousalld. Five Humdred ixty Dollars and Twenty-six Cents (\$493,560.26), Five Hundred and Sixty Dollars and Twenty-six Cents ( $\$ 493,560.2(6)$. The general lery for the rear 1919 of Forty-four Cents (\$.4+) as recommend by the Controller, Mayor, and established by the Com(ill, was reduced by the State Board of Tax Commissioners to Fortytwo Cents (\$.42), and the Board of Health General Fund of Five Cents and Eight Mills ( $\$ 0.0$ S $)$ as recommended by the Board of Health and established by the Council was reduced to Five Cents (\$8.05), thms camsing a loss of revemues from that estimated by the Commeil of One Hundred Thousimil, Four Hundred and Forty-three Dollars and Serenty-three Cents ( $\$ 100,443.73$ ).

I also desire to call the comerils attention to the fact that the Lesislature of 1919, in order to provide funds to pay a deficit areummlating since the lan went into effect in 1913, increased the ammal ley from Ten Cents ( $\$ .10$ ) to Twelve Cents ( $\$ .12$ ). Howerer, the Boanl of Health on acromit of the error in rahation and the reduction of their rate above referred to. did not get the benefit of the increased leys granted. so that in order to provide sufficient revemes to meet its
outstanding obligations, it is deemed necessary to increase its rat from Five ('ents ( $\$ 0.0$ ) to Eleven Cents ( $\$ .11$ ) for the year 1920 .
$O_{1}$ account of the present acute financial conditions and the exis ing high rate of interest, the city is mable to make temporary loan under said act of 1919 at six per cent. $(6 \%)$. The (remeral Assemb) at its special Session of $19 \% 0$ authorized the City of Indiamapol to negotiate a temporary loan for a period not exceeding two year at a rate of interest not exceeding. six and one-half per cent. ( $61 / 2 \% / \neq$ and in order to raise funds with which to pay tre outstanding it debtedness of the city and provide sutficient funds for the remand of the year, the Controller recommended a temporary loan of Six Hm dred Thousand Folars $(\$ 600,000.00)$ at a rate of interest not excee ing Six :and One-Half per cent. ( $(61 / 2 \%$ ). Three Hundred Thous:n Dollars ( $\$ 300.000 .00$ ) payable July 1, 1921, and Three Hundred Thot sand Dollars $(\$ 300,000.00)$ payable December 10,1021 , which is tho pending before the Council.

Therefore, the Seventr-four Cent $;(\$ .74)$ rate for general cit purposes includes a levy of more than Ten ('ents to cover this ten porary loan and interest.

Since the annual appropriation for 1919) were mate varions ne esasty increase in wages to meet the high cost of living have bee made to the employees of all the departments of the city.

The General Assembly at its special session in 1020 passed a act which required the city to establish a two phatoon system $i$ the Fire Department, which it is estimated will add Two Hundre and Seventy-five Thousand I Dollars (\$275,000.00) a year to the sat aries of city firemen. In addition to this the increases made in th salaries of police and fire departments since September, 1919, amomb to Three Hundred and Forty Thousind Dollars (\$340,000.00). Thi with increase in salaries in the Board of Works and other nepar ments, fully covers the difference in the estimated expenditures of One Miltion. Three Hundred and Fifty-seven Thous̉and. Four Hu dred and Thirty-four Dollars and Eighty-six Cents (\$1.357.434. Sf for the year 1921 over the expenses of 1920 .
I. therefore recommend to vour honorable body that the ta ley for the vear 1920 on each one Hmadred Dollars valuation of tas able property shall be as follows for city property :

My Dear Sir-I submit herewith for your consideration estimates uf apmontations for the sereral city departments, including the department of public parks, the department of recreation which is muler the board of public parks, the department of public health and charities and the department of sanitation, for the year 1921.

The estimates submitted by the different boards and departments were carefully scrutinized at a meeting with the boards and heads of lepartments and members of the common council on Thursdity night, lugust 19, 1920.

Reductions amounting to apmoximately Two Hundred Fifteen Thou and ( $\$ 215,000,00)$ Dollars were made and I feel that the estimates inbmitted to you should be recommended to the coumcil for phisalae.

The budget for 1921 calls for an increase of One Million. Three Hundred Fifty-four Thousand, Six Hundred Ninety-one Dollars and cixty-four Cents ( $\$ 1,374,691.64$ ), which is made up of the following
items：
1．Temporary loan

The balance of approximately One Humblred Forty Thousamal Ibol－ lars（ $\$ 140,000.040)$ is necessary to pay the increased salaries grante． the of her employees unter the board of publir works and the increase． cost of materials．

An error in the certification of the valuation of last year，together with the reduction in the tax rate by the tax board caused a loss of revenues to the city of approximately six Hundred Thirty Thousamb Iollars（ $\$(630,0$ ， 0.60$)$ ，which made the temporary loan，now before the council，necessary．

The financial condition of the city should be such that it would be able promptly at the end of each month to meet its obligations to the merchants and manufacturers from whom they purchase supplies．And the tax levy should be made without regard to political effect．

The apprasement of property for taxes within corporate limits of the city as certified to me by the county auditor is six Hundred Two Million，Five Hundred Twenty－five Thousamt，sixty Dollars（\＄（\％），－万ご．0，060．00）

The tax lever for genal city purposes of Seventy－four Cents（\＄．7． on each One Hundred lollars worth of property would amount to Four Million，Four Hundred Fifty－eight Thousand，six Hundred Eighty－fire I ollars and Forty－four Cents（ $\$ 4,458,685.44$ ）．

I estimate our miscellaneons receipts at Three Hundred Thousind Dollars（\＄300，000．00），which would produce Four Million，Seven Hum－ dred Fifty－dight Thousami，Six Hundred Eighty－fire Dollars and Forty－ four（＇ents（ $\$ 4,75 \mathbb{*}, 68 \% .44$ ）in revenues．

The estimates from the different departments amount to Four Mil lion，six Hundred Ninety－five Thousand six Hundred Ninety－one Dol－ lars ant sixty four Cents（ $\$ 4,695,691.64$ ），which would leave a balance of sixty－two Thousand，Nine Hundred Ninety－three Dollars and Eighty （＇ents（\＄（i2．993．s（1）for emergency expenses．I would，therefore，recom－ mend the following tax levy：

Gentlemen:
Attached hereto is respectfully submitted the estimate of the expenses of the Department of Public Parks for the year 1921.

The requested increase in the budget as you will note is under four items, viz:
1. Administration and Office.
2. General Maintenance.
3. Supplies and Equipment.
4. Outstanding Obligations.
(1) Under administration and office: An increase of \$T.6(6).00) is asked which is due to increases in salary of administration officers and
an increase in inspection expense of \(\$ 2,000.00\) on account of the proposed building program.
(2) When the budget for 1920 was submitted the ordinary labor scale was \(\$ 3.20\) per day. At present the rate is \(\$ 4.00\) per day, an increase of \(20 \%\) which together with a slight increase in the number of laborers increases the general maintenance from \(\$ 168,550\) to \(\$ 204,880\).
(3) The supplies and equipment owing to the general increase in prices of all commodities will run \(\$ 84,950\) as compared to \(\$ 67,294\) for 1920. This estimate includes a \(\$ 5,000.00\) increase for lighting exteusions and additional request for music of \(\$ 5,000.00\).
(4) The outstanding obligation item is practically the same as for 1020.

This estimate as may be noted is very conservative as emergency expenses and unforseen extensions hare not been included.
