The Council met, present a full board.

Mr. Goldsberry presented the following petition to wit

"Indianapolis April 4, 1840 To the Honorable Common Council of the City of Indianapolis, Gentlemen, The undersigned owners and holders of real estate on the north side of Washington Street, between Delaware and Pennsylvania Streets desire you to pass an ordinance requiring the said north side of Washington Street to be paved in the usual way within sixty days.

The above being a majority of the whole number of feet and the owners on said north side of Washington Street between Pennsylvania and Delaware Streets the prayer in said petition is granted and the Town Surveyor and Engineer be directed to make the necessary surveys and said pavements ordered to be made in conformity with the ordinance regulating side walks and pavements.

On Motion of Mr. Norwood

Resolved That a Committee be appointed to view Pogues run and if there is immediate danger to be apprehended from the drift to take measures to remove the same, and report at the next meeting

Messrs Norwood Seibert & Lyttle were appointed said Committee.
