Council met: present a full council except Goldsberry & Boatright

On Motion of Mr Cox

Resolved That the representative of each Ward together with the Marshall be authorized to have the public pumps in their respective Wards put in order immediately, and that it shall be their duty hereafter upon any of the pumps getting out of order to have the same repaired immediately, without any further orders from the Council.

Allowed Espy & Sloan \$2:50 for lumber as per account.

On Motion of Mr. Cox

Resolved That a committee be appointed to make such alterations in the platforms of the public cisterns as shall be necessary and to do such other repairs as is needed to make them sufficient

Messrs Cox Little & Norwood were appointed said committee.

Allowed E. Knight \$1:50 for expenditure on pumps etc.

On Motion of Mr. Cox

Ordered That the Marshal cause the side walks named in the Petition on Maryland Street to be completely graded and gravelled and that he also grade and gravel the crossings at the mouths of the alleys

On Motion of Mr. Norwood the Council proceeded to the election of a town auctioneer: Mr Joseph Little and Mr William Biddle having filed petitions soliciting said office

Whereupon on the eleventh ballot Mr. Joseph Little received 4 votes and Mr William Biddle 2 votes and one Bank vote was polled whereupon Joseph Little was declared duly elected from the 20 Novr. next till the 20th. November 1842 as town auctioneer

Indianapolis October 25. 1841

Wm Sheets and others presented the following petition,

"To the Hon Common Council of the town of Indianapolis: The undersigned owners of property on the south side of Washington Street between Illinois & Tennessee Streets respectfully represents that "the public interest will be promoted" by grading graveling and curbing the side walk on said south side of Washington Streets, your petitioners therefore pray your Honorable body to cause the said proposed improvement to be estimated & the same to be constructed & made complete by the first November next and cause the expense of the same to be assessed and Levied upon the property fronting to said proposed improvement agreeably to the ordinance on such cases made and provided.
