Indianapolis December 4, 1841

Council met: present, Cully President, Little, Cox, Loudon, Norwood and Boatright Councilmen.

John I. Ketcham presented a petition asking the privilege of gravelling side walks on Ohio Street which was granted and the work ordered to be done under the superintendance of Mr. Cox.

Julius Nicolai presented a petition praying that the sum of \$41:65 be refunded to him by the Council it being money paid by him for the privilege of vending spirits by retail for the time he has been deprived of that privilege by law, whereupon the prayer of said petition was granted and the said sum of \$ allowed said Nicolai.

On Motion of Mr. Loudon

Resolved That those persons who own property on the East side of Illinois and who have not graded and gravelled their side walks according to the order entered on 26 March last on that subject be notified by the Marshal to complete said grading and gravelling within six days and that upon their failure to comply with said notice that the Marshal proceed forthwith to do the same under the regulations of the ordinances on that subject.

On Motion of Mr. Boatright

Resolved That James Blake & John H Wright be requested to cooperate with the Councilmen in the respective Wards in superintending and directing the improvement of the wells, cisterns and pumps in the town of Indianapolis.

On Motion of Mr. Norwood

Ordered That the Marshal be directed to make a gravel foot walk from the corner at Basil Browns to the corner at John Turners.

On Motion of Mr. Norwood

Resolved That Basil Brown have the liberty to take gravel from the hill at Morris Morris' and make a gravel walk from said Browns to John Woolens and thence across Tennessee Street.

On Motion of Mr. Cox

Ordered That the Marshal be directed to contract with some person to make a side walk around the West side of the Governors Circle immediately and that said work be done under the superintendance of the Engineer and Messrs Norwood & Goldsberry.

An ordinance entitled "An Ordinance for licensing street Pedlars and Hawkers" was read amended passed and ordered to be published.

On Motion of Mr. Little

Resolved That a committee be appointed to examine the ravine near A W Russells property on Virginia Avenue south of Pogue's run and report what repairs if any are necessary.

Messrs Little & Norwood were appointed said committee.

Allowed William Sullivan \$22.75 as fees a President as per account.

Allowed James Green \$4.50 for work on alley

(Isd. 10 Decr. to Van)

Allowed Matthew & Ingram Little \$7 for hauling gravel

(Isd. 10 Decr.)

Allowed James Vanblaricum \$17.50 for hauling etc.

Allowed James Vanblaricum \$4.67 - for money paid for Council

(Isd. 10 Decr.)

Ordered that the Secretary issue orders to the President and Councilmen for their respective salaries for the Present year.
