On motion of Mr. Norwood The Resolution adopted at the last meeting of the Council extending the time to the Citizens on Illinois Street to improve their side walks was reconsidered: when the original Resolution was lost: a motion was then made to extend the time for said work sixty days which was lost.

On Motion of Mr. Little

Resolved that a committee be appointed to examine and ascertain whether the alley East of East Street has been vacated. Messrs Little & Norwood were appointed said committee.

The Treasurer made his monthly report which was adopted

The Weighmaster made his monthly report which was adopted

Mr. Goldsberry from the Committee on Horse Carriage reported that the Carriage was completed and had been accepted by said Committee Whereupon

John Lister having a received a majority of the votes was duly declared elected an auctioneer for the town of Indianapolis for one year upon his complying with the Ordinance on that subject.
