Council met: present a full Council.

The President laid before the Council Certain Resolutions adopted by the Marion Engine Company, which was on motion of Mr Richards laid on the table.

Mr Richards from the committee on wells made a report accompanied by the following resolution which were adopted

Resolved that the following described wells be and they are hereby declared public wells and as such are worthy of being kept in repair at the public expense viz at Griffiths on Illinois Street - at Norwood corner Illinois Street - at Union Row Washington Street - at Collins Corner - at Wrights pork house - at Phipps corner - at Gov Rays row - at Matthew Littles and at Franklin Institute on Circle Street -

An Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to repeal an ordinance entitled an ordinance concerning dogs" ordained and established May 17. 1842" was read amended ordained passed and ordered to be published.

On Motion of Mr Black

Ordered That the Collector and Marshal be directed not to receive in payment of dues to the town one fourth per cent state scrip.

On Motion of Mr Goldsberry

Ordered that a tax of ten cents on Each hundred dollars be levied on all real and personal estate returned by the Lister for the present year; also that a tax of one dollar be levied on each poll returned by said Lister - and also that a tax of one dollar be levied on each dog returned as aforesaid

Ordered that the Collectors salary for the present year be fixed at three hundred dollars.

On Motion of Mr Loudon the Council proceeded to the election of a collector.

Whereupon Robert C Allison was appointed collector for the present year.

The President laid before the Council the following petition viz

"To the Honorable the Common Council of the town of Indianapolis, The undersigned your petitioners believing it will be for the public good and being the owners of a majority of feet fronting on Delaware Street and on the West side thereof between Vermont Street and Washington Street, would respectfully represent unto your honors that they are desirous of grading and gravelling the side walk between the points aforesaid on said West side of Delaware Street; and humbly pray your Honors to pass such orders and requisitions as may enable and compel the owners between said points to grade and gravel their side walks in accordance with the ordinances of the Common Council of said town on the subject of side walks within such time as may be reasonable and your petitioners etc. owners names
