Indianapolis September 9. 1842

Council met: Absent Messrs Richards and Boatright of Council.

The President presented report of W Biddle Auctioneer, for quarter ending 20th August 1842: which was read and received.

The President, according to request, presented an ordinance to limit the number of Hogs permitted to run at large; which was read twice and refered to a select committee, on the motion of Mr. Black, Messrs Black Loudon and Goldsberry were appointed said committee.

On Motion of Mr Black

Resolved That the Marshal be directed to cause the public pump at Mr. Littles corner to be put in repair with an understanding that said Little will hereafter keep the same in order at his own expense.

Mr Black presented the remonstrance of W.Y. Wiley and others against making side walks west side of Delaware Street from Ohio to Vermont Streets. Referred to committee on streets and alleys.

Mr Loudon moved that an additional member be added to committee on fire department. Mr Loudon was added to said committee.

And the Council adjourned

Council Chamber
Indianapolis October 1. 1842

Council met. Present Messrs Cully, President, Loudon Black and Richards, members of Council.

Mr. Black from select committee to which was refered an ordinance to regulate hogs running at large in the town of Indianapolis, reported the same with two amendments: First to fill the blank with the number three; Second to make the ordinance take effect from and after the 1st day of November next; which amendments were concurred in, the ordinance read a third time and passed unaminously.

Mr Black presented the petition of J M Ray and others on behalf of the 1st Presbyterian Church praying the privilege of grading the side walk in front of said Church; which on motion of Mr. Black was refered to the committee on streets and alleys.

The President laid before the Council the reports of Mr Biddle and Messrs Wiley and Little Auctioneers to 18th September 1842. which were read and received.

The President presented his quarterly report of proceedings before him in his judicial capacity and the amount of moneys collected and paid over to the Treasurer, which was read and received.

Mr. Loudon presented Treasurers reports which were read & received

Mr. Black presented Weighmasters monthly report which was read & received

Mr. Loudon presented account in favor of Bolton & Pattison for advertising which was referred to committee on claims

On Motion of Mr. Loudon

Ordered that the Secretary issue orders to officers for 3d. quarters salary

Mr. Loudon presented the petition of Dan. King and others praying that the fine assessed on John Michael of \$50. for selling liquor by the small without license be in part remitted.

On Motion of Mr Loudon - the petition was laid on the table.
