Indianapolis March 13. 1845

Council met; present a full Council

The President presented the application of Jeremiah Collins for Grocery license which being examined

It is ordered; that the Secretary issue Grocery license to said Collins upon his paying the amount of said license and complying with the ordinances of said town said license to be for one year from 7 March 1845.

The President laid before the Council the Report of the committee appointed to settle with the Marshal and collector which is as follows;

To the Common Council - The undersigned on behalf of the Committee appointed to examine the papers accounts & receipts of Mr. R.C. Allison Collector and Supervisor for the year 1842. with a view to settlement would respectfully report that they have discharged that duty and submit the following as the result of their examination.

recommend the adoption of the Resolution herewith presented.

Resolved That the Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized to settle with R C Allison Collector & Supervisor and give him a clear receipt upon his presenting to said Treasurer a statement from the Clerk that he said Collector & Supervisor has filed with him a delinquent list of taxes for 1842, a list of taxes collected or delinquent omitted by the lister and also a delinquent list of road taxes of 1842 all regularly made out & certified and paying into the Treasury the sum of Three hundred & fifty seven 24/100 dollars

Mr. Record presented an act in favor of J. L. Mothershead for \$0:75 which was referred to Committee on claims

Mr Nowland presented petition of Harvey & Morton pet for Auction license - when on motion said Harvey & Morton were appointed Auctioneers in the town of Indianapolis for one year upon their complying with the Ordinances of said town

Council Chamber
Indianapolis March 27. 1843

Council met Messrs Black Nowland and Records of the Council present -

Mr David V. Culley Presented his commission as President of the Common Council and took his seat as such.

Messrs Samuel Goldsberry councilman elect for the second ward & Andrew A Loudon Councilman elect for the fourth ward and Samuel S Rooker Councilman elect for the sixth ward presented their certificates of election, was sworn into office and took their seats as Councilmen.

Ordered That the Salary of the Secretary for the coming year be fixed at one hundred and twenty five dollars.

Ordered That the Salary of the Treasurer for the coming year be fixed at Sixty five dollars

Ordered That the Salary of the Marshal for the coming year be fixed at one hundred dollars

Ordered That the Salary of the Supervisor for the coming year be fixed at one hundred dollars
