Indianapolis September 6th 1845

The Council convened in regular meeting, Present Joseph A. Levy, President, and all the Councilmen, except Mr. Vanblaricum.

Mr. Griffith presented the Report of the Treasurer of the corporation for the month of August, showing receipts to the amount of \$243.50 3/4 Expenditures to the amount of \$223.29 1/4 -- leaving a balance in the Treasury of \$20.31 1/2 -- which report was read and received.

The President laid before the Council the Report of the Weighmaster for the month of August. Which was read and received.

Ordered, That the Secretary issue License to Mr. Joseph Little as an Auctioneer, upon his compliance to the provisions of the Ordinance regulating such Licenses.

Ordered, That the clerk of the Markets be directed to let out the vacant stalls, to persons applying therefor, until the Next annual letting, at prices proportionate to the length of time, for which they wish to occupy same.
