Resolved, That Professor Bronson, be privileged to give Lectures on Elecution, Physicology and Music, within the limits of the Corporation, without license, which was unanimously adopted.

Ordered, That the Secretary issue orders to the President, & Councilmen for their $\frac{1}{2}$ years salary, ending Sept. 30th 1845, and to the Officers of the corporation for their 2nd quarters Salary, ending same date.
