On Motion of Mr. Cady

Resolved, That the sum of Twenty five dollars be and the same is hereby refunded to Joshua M. W. Langsdale, being one half of the amount paid by him for license to retail spirituous liquors one year from the 7th day of March 1846 under which he has sold such liquors for the period of Six months, and is anxious to surrender said license to the Common Council the same being annulled by the action of the Legislature and the people.

On Motion of Mr. Montague

Resolved, That the Council cause Washington Street, to be graded with rock in the centre of the Street, from East Street to the bridge on said street over Pagues Run, at a cost not exceeding thirty dollars, under the superintendance of the Supervisor and the Councilman of the 1st. Ward.

On Motion of Mr. Louden

Resolved, That the Supervisor be directed to cause a certain Mud hole on Vermont Street south of Dr. Mears' residence, and also one on Ohio Street to be abated as Nuisances.

On Motion of Mr. Cady

Resolved. That the sum of Twenty five dollars, be and the same is hereby allowed, for the bridge and work on the drain, situate on the west side of Illinois Street and south of Washington Street, made and performed under the direction of the Councilman for the 5th Ward.

On Motion of Mr Harrison

Resolved, That Messrs Goldsberry, Montague & Cady be, and they are hereby appointed a Committee to examine the bridges on Pennsylvania and Meridian Streets, over Pogues Run, and if they find them to be built according to the contract in every sense of the word, that they be directed to instruct the Secretary to issue Orders to the contractor, for the balance due them for the same.

The Council met upon call. Present The President, Messrs Harrison, Louden, Cady, and VanBlaricum, Councilmen.

On Motion of Mr. Harrison

Resolved. That the President of the Council be requested to collect all the facts, so far as he can, in relation to the case of the breaking of Dr. John L. Mothershead's Buggie, and that he submit the same to the attorneys for the town for their investigation, and if on examination it shall appear that the Town is liable for damages, the President shall inform the Dr. that the Council will order him paid his damages without further investigation or suit.

On Motion of Mr. Cady

Resolved. That the Secretary be, and he is hereby directed to draw an Order in favor of John S. Watts, for the amount of his bill for Ground rent, amounting to Twelve dollars and also for costs occurred before Wm. Sullivan Justice of the Peace, in the suit by said Watts, to recover the amount of his bill and in which judgment was obtained before said Sullivan.
