

"Indianapolis, June 7th 1847

Saml S. Rooker Esq

Beleiving as I most solemnly do, that an alliance of a most unjust and unholy character, has been entered into between four of the newly elected members of the council, for the purpose of thwarting and defeating every measure of importance or not, which may be introduced for the benefit of the ward, I have had the honor to represent, - and feeling that such an alliance, has been concealed and brought forth from principles, derogatory to the character of honorable men, - And beleiving that the same spirit which dictated this alliance, will lead to the disbursement and expenditure of monies unjustly, whereby a certain portion of the city will be deprived of rights, which they had reason to expect they would receive at the hands of the council -- I have determined to retire from the body over which you preside, and hereby tender my resignation as a member of the city council.

Resolved, That a committee of three be appointed to call on A.W. Harrison late councilman of the Sixth ward of the city, and procure from him a report of the receipts and expenditures of Road Monies received and expended by him as such councilman, and also to receive from him such sum or sums of Road Monies in his hands unexpended. --- Messrs Tutewiler, King & Wingate were appointed said committee.

Mr. Cady presented a Report of the receipts and expenditures, of Road Monies in the 5" Ward of the Town of Indianapolis showing a balance due him of Twenty five dollars and thirty five cents Which report was read & received and the aforesaid balance allowed to him----

The council met upon a call, Present a full council except Mr. Tutewiler



The object of the meeting being to fill the vacancy occasioned by the resignation of Abram W. Harrison, late councilman of the 6th Ward, as constituted by the charter granted by the late General Assembly to the city of Indianapolis, after several ineffectual ballotings, the election was on Motion postponed until the next meeting of the council.

On motion of Mr. Wingate

Resolved, That Joseph Heimbaugh, be permitted to construct a Ditch along the west side of East Street South of Pogue's Run, for the purpose of draining the water from said street, to said Run, and when completed according to the directions of the Street commissioner, said Commissioner is hereby required to execute a receipt to said Heimbaugh, for the road tax that may be assessed against him for the present year.

Ordered That the Secretary be and he is hereby instructed to place the Delinquent List of Corporation taxes returned for the year 1846 by Henry Ohr, late collector, into the hands of the Treasurer, taking his receipt therefor, And that the Treasurer upon the reception of such list, proceed to enforce the collection of said taxes without delay according to law.

Ordered, That the Secretary be and he is hereby authorized to issue to the several persons who were appointed to serve as Inspectors, Judges, and clerks if the election at which the charter incorporating the city was adopted, and the following election of Officers under said charter, drafts upon the city Treasury when called upon so to do, for their services at such election viz.

The council met upon a call, Present a full council except Mr. Tutewiler.

The proceedings of the last meeting were read and approved.

The President announced the Object of the meeting to be the prevention of the further spread of the Small Pox or Varioloid, which upon the statement of Dr. John L. Mothershead was pronounced to be in the city. Whereupon it was

Ordered, That the Marshall be directed and empowered to remove forthwith without the city those persons who are infected with the Small Pox or Varioloid to some suitable and safe place to prevent the further spread of said disease in the city, and to procure attendance upon said persons during their sickness of said disease, so as to secure their comfort and medical aid, and make report of his doings in the premises to the city council at their next meeting.

On Motion of Mr Wingate

Resolved, That the Marshall be empowered to draw upon the City Treasurer, through the Secretary for a sum of money sufficient
