That the Mayor be and he is hereby authorised and required to discharge all duties of a Judicial character prescribed in the Ordinance for the regulation and government of the town of Indianapolis to be performed by the President of the common council, until otherwise provided by the city council.

On Motion of Mr Cady -

Resolved. That the expenditures authorized under a resolution of the council of the 7th inst to be made on the South Side of Pogue's Run On Meridian Street, by the commissioner of Streets are hereby directed to be made under the superintendance of the councilman of the 5th Ward.

Be it further Resolved. That the commissioner of Streets forthwith notify James Blake to repair the breach in the Embankment of Pogue's Run so far as situated on his land sufficiently to keep the water from Meridian Street And that in default of said repairs being made in three days after Notice given, the council will proceed to make them at his expense.

And on Motion. The council adjourned.

Resolved. That the Order of the council of the 12th inst, directing the Marshall to remove without the city those persons infected with the Small Pox or Varioloid, and the resolution of the same date making an Appropriation to defray any expenses incurred by such removal, be and the same is hereby rescinded and repealed.

Ordered. That the Marshall be and directed and empowered to cause such an obstruction to be placed in Washington Street where



the same intersects Mississippi and West Streets as to effectually prevent any further travel upon such portion of said Street. And after such Obstruction is so placed in said Street, to employ two suitable and discreet persons, One to stand at each of said Streets intersecting Washington Street aforesaid to warn all persons from travelling upon such Obstructed portion of said Street, And to prevent any person or persons from removing said Obstruction so placed as aforesaid.

And the council adjourned.

That the commissioner of Streets notify the property holders on Illinois Street, or their agents between Washington Street and Michigan Street to grade and gravel their respective Sidewalks on said Street agreeably to the established grade of said Street, and that they be allowed to call on the city Engineer for his services, and if said Side walks be not completed within forty days after their Notification then the commissioner of Streets is hereby further Ordered to proceed without delay to finish the same agreeably to this order at the cost of the person refusing or neglecting the Same.

Mr King Offered for adoption the following resolution towit.

Resolved That the commissioner of Streets be and he is hereby directed to Open out the ditch On the west side of Illinois Street between Washington & Illinois Street so as to effectually drain the water out of said ditch that naturally comes in to it. and that the expenses incurred thereby be defrayed by the Road Money of the 3rd Ward. The Ayes & Nays being demanded on the passage of the resolution, Those who voted affirmatively were Messr Gates, Tutewiler, King Wingate & the President -5. Negative Mr Cady 1. So said resolution was adopted.
