The Council met pursuant to adjournment. Present Messr Gates,
King, Tutewiler, Rooker and Morris.

The President being absent, Mr Gates was appointed President
pro tem.

The State Legislature having passed an act amendatory of the
City Charter, empowering the City Council at any time to levy and
collect a Special tax upon the taxables of the city for the pur-
pose of defraying the necessary expenses of any measure which may
be adopted by said council to prevent the spread of the Small
pox in said City

It was Ordered, That there be levied on the assessment returned
by the assessor of the city of Indianapolis for the year 1847. a
special tax of Fifteen cents on each One hundred dollars of real
and personal property, and One dollar on each poll, for the pur-
pose of defraying the expenses necessary to prevent the spread of
the Small pox within the limits of the city, and for the purpose
of erecting a suitable building to be used as a City Hospital.

Ordered That the Secretary proceed forthwith to make out
such Tax List, and upon the completion thereof, deliver the same
to the city Treasurer, taking his receipt therefor; And that the
Treasurer thereupon be and he is hereby directed to proceed
forthwith to the collection of said Taxes. and that he demand,
receive and collect the same in money within forty days from the
reception of said list.

Ordered, That the tax levied upon the assessment returned by
the assessor for the year 1847. against Mr Baldwin, of Six hun-
dred dollars be and the same is hereby remitted. it being upon
an unfinished building.

February 21st 1848 at $\frac{1}{2}$ past 6 o'clock P.M.
