

Council Chamber
Indianapolis May 1 1848.

The Council met. Present. Chas W Cady President, Messrs
Gates Tutewiler, King Rooker.

Proceedings of the last meeting were read and approved.

Mr Rooker moved to take from the Table the report of the
Physicians appointed to perform vaccinnations. and that they be
allowed Twenty five dollars each for such services. which Motion
did not prevail.

Ordered. That the President pay over to the city Funds held
by him in trust. to the Treasurer who may be duly elected and
qualified, taking duplicate receipts thereof and filing one of them
with the Secretary of the City Council.

On Motion of Mr King

Resolved That the sum of Twenty five dollars be and the same
is hereby allowed to each of the Physicians appointed to perform
vaccinnation which sums are to paid out of the Small pox Tax.

The President, on behalf of himself and other petitioners for
the special improvement of Washington Street between Fogues Run.
Bridge and the Eastern line of the city asked a modification of
the Order directing said improvement, so far as the depth of the
stone from nine inches to six inches

Whereupon it was Ordered That the Secretary make his assessment
for said improvement agreeable to the request of the Petitioners
and notify them of their respective assessments.

The President introduced an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance
in relation to Wood Wagons. and the sale and Measurement of
Wood Approved March 20th 1848. which was read & approved.

On Mo of Mr King Resolved Unanimously That the thanks of
the city council be and they are hereby tendered to Chas W.
Cady for the very efficient manner in which he has discharged
the duties of President.

And on Motion the council adjourned.

The Councilmen elected pursuant to the provisions of the Charter incorporating the city of Indianapolis, On Saturday April 29. 1848. met at the council chamber on Monday the 1st day of May 1848. presented their certificates of election, with the proper oaths of office endorsed thereon, and took their seats viz.

And Organized by the election on the second ballot of George A. Chapman as President of the city council, for the term of One year, and until his successor is elected and qualified,

On motion of Mr Alford, The Council proceeded to the election of a Secretary, Messrs Alford & Eaglesfield acting as Tellers.

Whereupon, On the first ballot James G. Jordan having received a majority of all the votes cast, was declared duly elected Secretary of the City Council of Indianapolis, to serve as such, for the term of One year and until his successor is elected and qualified.

Mr Tutewiler offered for adoption the following

Whereas. It appears that the 6th Ward failed to open a poll at the recent city election, for the purpose of selecting a councilman for the present year. And whereas. by such failure to elect, the office of councilman for said Ward is hereby declared vacant. And whereas it is the desire of the Council to appoint a councilman for said Ward, in accordance with the wishes thereof.

Therefore Resolved. That the voters in said 6th Ward be, and they are hereby recommended to hold an informal poll on Saturday the 6th day of May inst choosing their Own Officers therefor. for the purpose of giving their votes for a person of their own choice to be appointed by the city council.

On Motion, The council adjourned to meet on the 2nd inst at 2 oClock P.M.
