On motion of Mr Eaglesfield Resolved That the bid of George Youngerman for the construction of said Culvert & ditch, being in the aggregate One hundred and ten dollars, be accepted, and that Mr Youngerman enter into bond in the penalty of Two hundred dollars for the completion of said Work in forty days. from this date.

On Motion, the resignation of James Greer as Treasurer presented at the last meeting of the Council, was accepted. And the council proceeded to an election, to fill the vacancy Occasioned by such resignation Whereupon On the Eight ballot James H Kennedy. having recd a majority of the votes given was declared duly elected Treasurer to fill such vacancy and until his successor is elected and qualified.

And the Council adjourned until the 23rd inst at 2. PM.
