Indianapolis Dec 4. 1848.

The Council met. Present George A. Chapman President. Messrs Brandt, Alford, Eaglesfield & Seibert. Councilmen.

The proceedings of the three last meetings were read and approved.

The President laid before the Council, the Report of the Treasurer, exhibiting the receipts and expenditures at the Treasury, during the month of November last past, and up to the present date, which report with accompanying Vouchers, was examined, and Ordered to be filed.

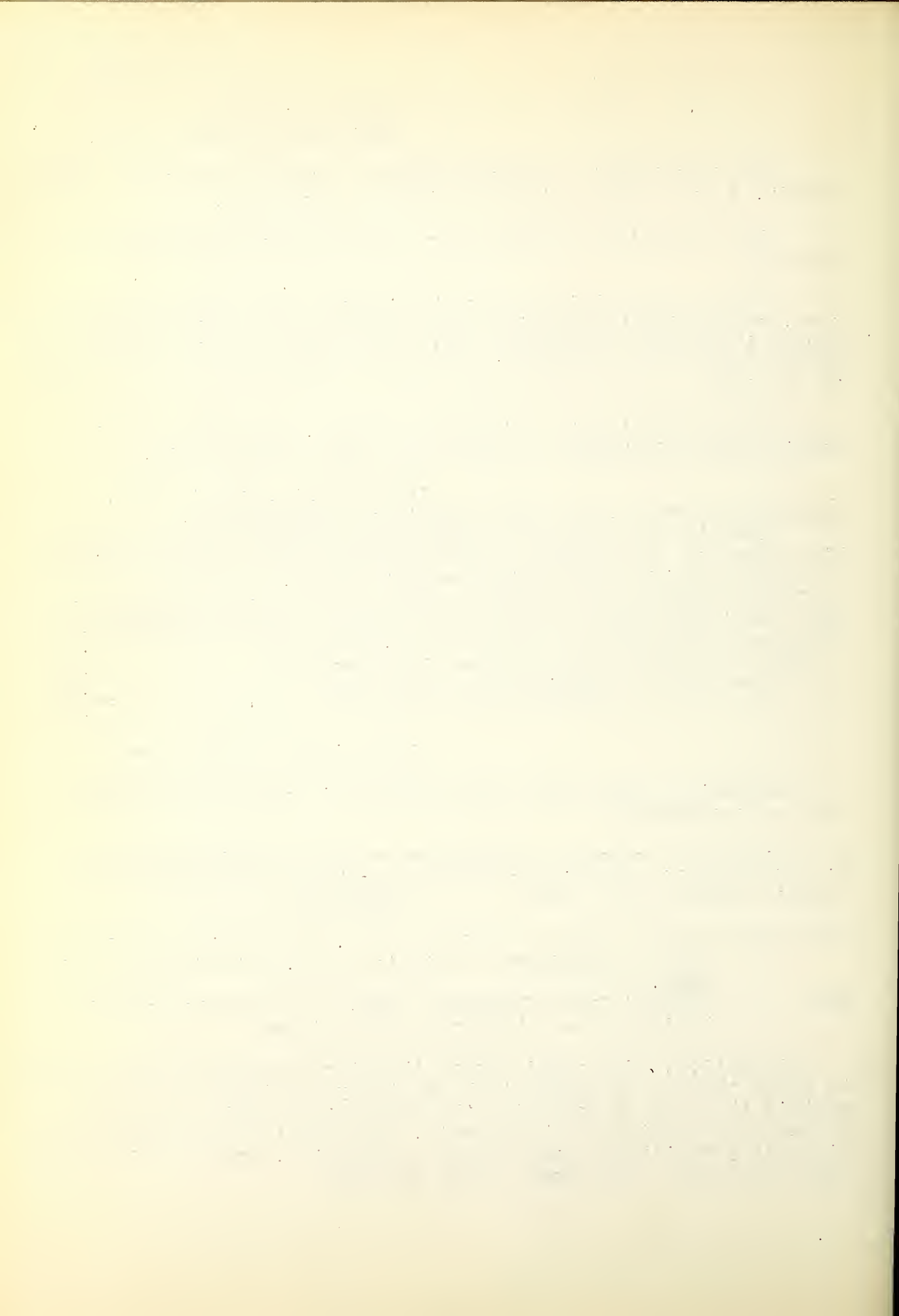
On motion, the report was concurred in and the allowances made as recommended

Mr Alford, reported the Slough or pond on Indiana Avenue, filled under his superintendance, agreeably to the Order of the council adopted Oct 2 1848 Whereupon.

881 to 884 Allowed, Evils & Coleman \$53.62 cts being a deduction from the Engineers estimate of \$3.83 in full for said week.

880 Allowed Cyrus Catterson \$22.00 for hauling gravel on National road. between canal bridges.

On motion, The committee on the Fire Department were directed to cause the Marion Engine to be suitably repaired, and to ascertain the cost of repairing the Good Intent Engine, to report at the next meeting of the council. Also to take into consideration the propriety of purchasing a new engine, and upon what terms and conditions a new one can be procured.



Ordered That Mr Kennedy cause the roof of the Council Chamber to be suitably repaired.

The Council met upon a call of the President. Present Geo. A. Chapman, President, Messr Brandt, Alford, Mayhew & Sibert.

Allowed Wm Vale \$62.50 for excavation across South Street
for Pogues Run.
(Nos 15.16.17.18.19.20.21.28. 69 in full)

Sundry articles accounts of Wm Vale, for labor performed within the limits of said city were presented, and referred to the committee on claims.

The President laid before the council a petition of R. Mayhew, for filling grade on Pennsylvania Street south, with gravel. which was referred to A select committee consisting of Messr Sibert, Chapman & Alford.

The President laid before the council a written request of the Commissioners of the Indianapolis & Peru Rail Road company for privilege to lay down and keep a **track** for Horse power upon and along any of the streets running north and south in Indianapolis which lie east of Pennsylvania Street. Read and laid upon the table.

The President laid before the council an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance in relation to the connection of Rail Roads, through the City of Indianapolis" Read and Ordained and established
