Minutes of the proceedings read and approved for two last meetings

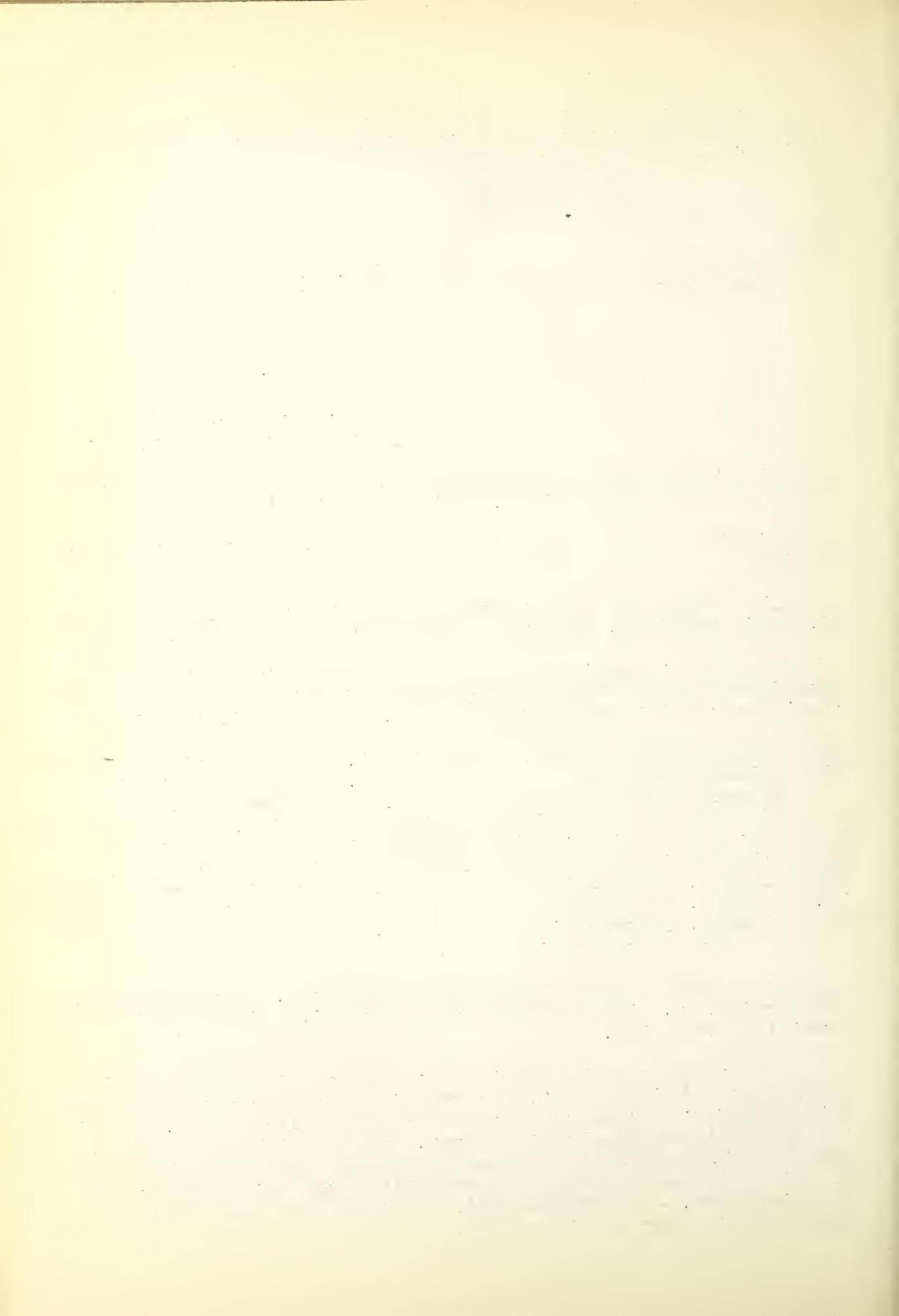
The Treasurers report and Accompanying vouchers were presented, read examined, approved, and Ordered to be filed.
