Special meeting November 1849

Council Chamber

Indianapolis Nov 20th 1849

The Council met, Present all the members except Mr Bates.

The following accounts were presented and allowed viz.

(404) Morris & Irwin       \$8.00 for lumber & hauling same to public  
burying ground.

(No. 402) VanBlaricum & Jones  
3.16 for Hooks for markets.

On application by Mr Sulgrove permission was granted him to sell on the best terms, the old tenement situate on the school lot in the 5th Ward, the proceeds of such sale to go into the school fund of the city.

On application by Mr Montague, permission was granted him to use certain sills and plank in the building of a bridge over a drain in South Street.

A Proposition was received from the Independent Relief Fire Company for the sale of the "Good Intent" Engine to the Council, for the sum of three hundred dollars, payable in three, six and nine months. Wherefrom,

On Motion, The proposition was referred to the Committee on the Fire department with instructions to tender said Company the orders of the city for the purchase of said Engine payable as proposed by said company.

Ordered That the city attorney take an appeal to the Marion Circuit Court, from the judgment recently rendered by William Sullivan J P. in favor of William Vail against the city, and that the President of the council file the requisite appeal bond.

Mr Montague, moved that the committee appointed to loan the school fund be instructed not to make any further loans of said fund. And the yeas and nays being demanded on the question of adoption. Those who voted yea, were Messrs Culley, King, Rooker, Montague & Mr President 5. Nays Mr Sulgrove 1. So said motion prevailed.

Mr Sulgrove asked and obtained leave from further service on said committee.

And the council adjourned.
