## Special Meeting

Council Chamber

Indianapolis March 11th/50

The Council Met, Present Messrs Bates, King, Rooker-Cully, Sulgrove, Montague and Mr President.

The object of the meeting being the consideration of the Bond given by Mr Evans to the Council for the completion of four Brick School Houses in said City.

On motion of Mr Bates, The Bond of Mr Evans as presented by Mr. Montague was Read and approved of by the Council.

A petition was presented, signed by E. Browning, J. M. Landis and Chs. Glazier asking permission to grade the side walks on the Diagonal Street running (South East) and on the East side of Alabama Street from Pogues Run South to Louisiana Street, Whereupon the Council passed the following Order.

Ordered, That said petitioners be granted the above request, Provided they give public notice to the property holders upon those Streets whose side walks are too low, to take the surplus Earth, within Thirty days from the date of said notice, or they will otherwise dispose of it. Provided also that said Surplus earth be used in improving the Streets or Rail Roads within the City, But for no private use whatever.

A petition signed by T. A. Morris in behalf of the Presidents of certain Rail Roads therein named, praying leave to construct a Union track across certain Streets in this City was presented to the Council. Whereupon it was Ordered, That fifteen days notice of the pendency of said petition be published, in accordance with the Ordinance established March 12th 1849.

On motion of Mr Cully, a Committee was appointed to cancel all the Orders and Scrip on hand, Whereupon the Mr Cully and the President were appointed said Committee.

(539) The Committee on Claims Reported Morrisons and Majors Bill correct, and the Council ordered that said Bill be paid.

Ordered, That (for the purpose of improving his property) Morris be permitted to grade the side walks upon the East and South sides of Square No 87, and use the earth in improving the Streets or upon the Rail Road embankments within the City, But not for any private use whatever,
