The Council Met, Present Messrs Bates, Cully, King, Rooker, Montague, & Mr President.

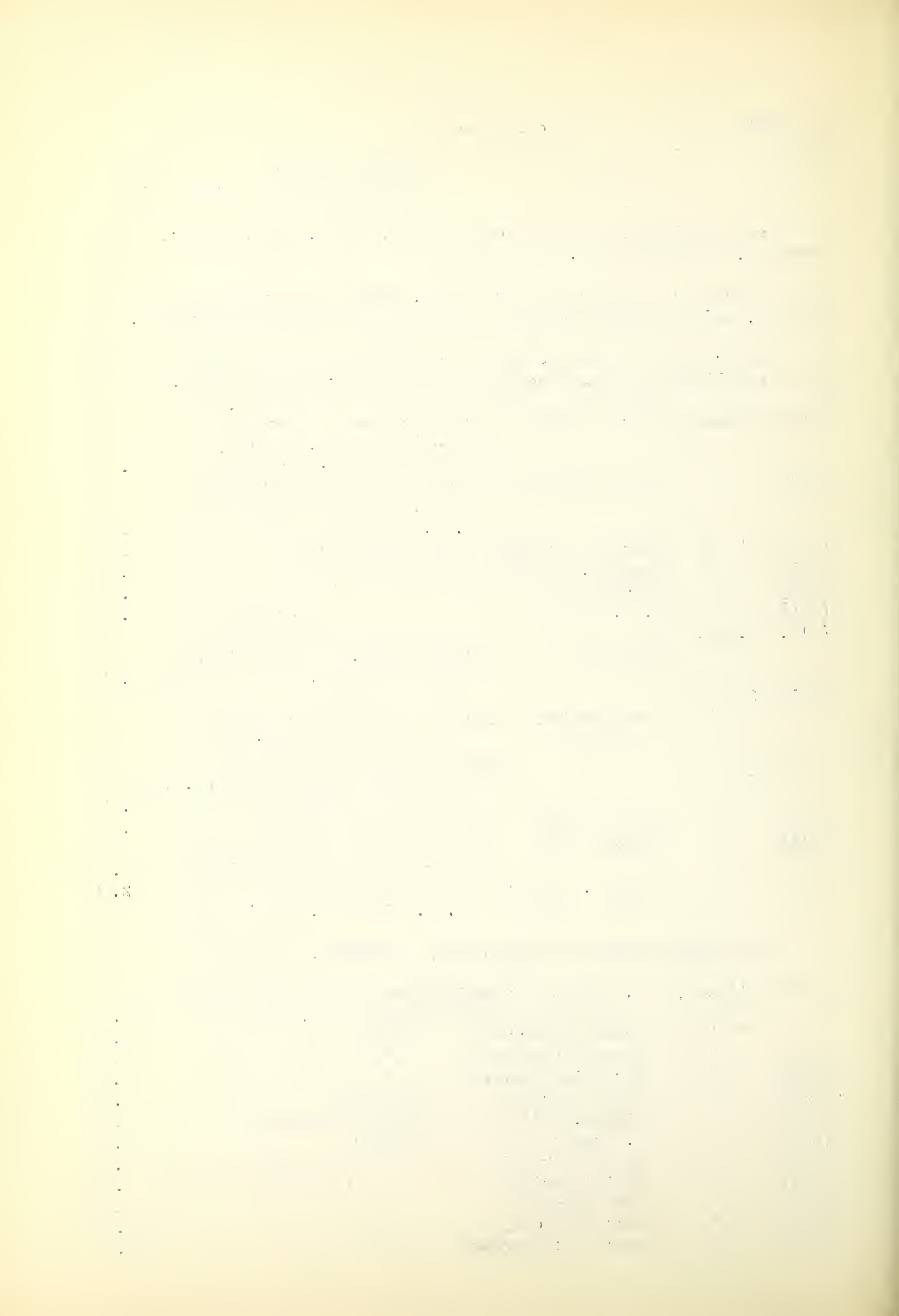
The Treasurers Report was presented, Read and approved of by the Council, and his yearly Report also Read and ordered to be printed.

(602) Ordered, That Fredrick Fouttze be allowed the sum of of \$50.00 for building the carriage for the O. K. Bucket Company said amount being voted to said Company by the City Council for that specific purpose.

The Petition of Valentine Butch was presented and Read, praying the Council to remit a fine imposed upon him by the Mayor of the City, and on motion, the prayer of the Petitioner was granted.

The Committee who were appointed to examine the Bridges across Pogues Run, made the following Report, in accordance with a Resolution heretofore passed by the Council.

That they have made the examination required by said Resolution and are of opinion, that the Bridges on Pogues Run should be raised to an elevation of seven feet above low water mark, and the Streets connected therewith graded to conform to the elevation of the Bridges; this, the Committee believe would vent the water and drift at high floods without danger to the Bridges, The grade adopted by the Engineer at the Crossings of the several Streets and alleys of the City by the Terre Haute, Rail Road, the Committee believe will not materially, if at all, injure the Streets and alleys it crosses, and therefore, would recommend no further action as to said Rail Road track at present.
