The Committee appointed in accordance with the provisions of a Resolution adopted at a previous meeting of the Council in relation to furnishing the necessary aid to sick and indigent persons, the same to be paid out of the City Treasury, made the following report.

To the President of the City Council of Indianapolis:

Your Committee who were appointed to inquire into the expediency of procuring nurses to wait upon those persons who are unable to provide for themselves during the present time and so long as the sickness exist, Beg leave to Report, That the President be authorized to appoint as many persons to wait upon the sick as shall be wanted, said persons so appointed, shall be paid out of the funds of the City Treasury, if those they nurse while sick are not able to pay them, said persons who are appointed or shall be, are to be allowed a compensation of not less than one dollar and fifty cents, nor more than five dollars for each and every twenty four hours their services are so rendered, to the sick, Provided however, the sum in each case, be allowed and determined by a vote of the

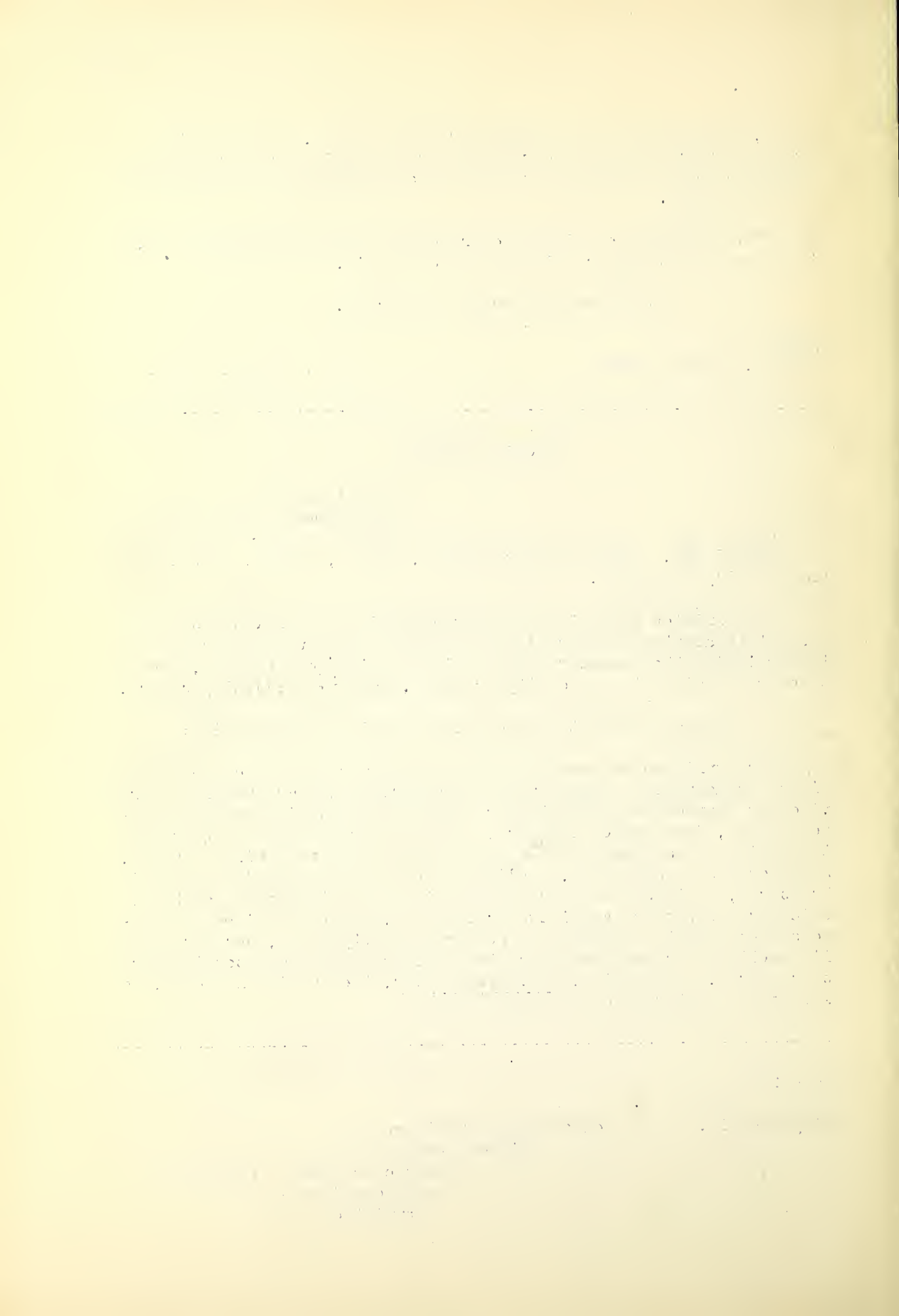
