Indianapolis Sept 2nd/1850

The Council Met. Present, Messrs Loudon, Landis, Eckert, McQuat, Helsetgesson and Mr Cully President.

The Reports of the Treasurer, Secretary and Streets Commissioner were presented, Read and approved of by the Council, and the Secretaries ordered to be spread upon the minutes.



The Committee on Streets made the following Report,

We the undersigned Committee on Streets Report in reference to the prayer of the property owners on New York Street between Noble and Alabama Streets as follows,

That said property owners as aforesaid be allowed to grade said Street between Noble and Alabama Streets, Also that they be allowed to grade and gravel the side walk on the South side of New York Street between said Noble and Alabama Streets.

The following Resolution was Read and adopted.

Resolved, That William Sheets, be authorized to remove and appropriate to filling up the adjacent lots, the surplus dirt on the sidewalks opposite Lots No 11 & 12 in Square No 44, unless the same be removed within Thirty days by any person wishing to use the same on any of the side walks in said City.

On Motion the following Resolution was adopted.

Resolved, That the Masonic Hall company be permitted to make their side walk on Tennessee Street between Washington Street and Kentucky Avenue fifteen feet wide.

A Resolution was introduced, the purport of which was, the shingling of the space now open between the two car Houses located on the Rail Road, and immediately upon Merrill Street, after the reading of which, said Resolution was referred to the Committee on Streets.


The following Order was read, and passed.

Whereas heretofore there was an Order passed to grade and pave the side walk on South side of Washington Street between Illinois and Tennessee Streets, and under said order, a part of the same was graded and paved, and a part remains as before the passage of the Order, Therefore Resolved, that

the Street Commissioner be ordered to give the owners of said property where the side walk is not finished between the points above named a notice of twenty days to commence the said paving, and upon failure, said Commissioner shall proceed forthwith to grade and pave the same.

Ordered, That the Street Commissioner raise the foot Bridge at the corner of Washington and New Jersey Streets, so as to suit the grade



of the side walk, and if necessary make the bridge anew.

Ordered, That in accordance with a petition presented by Little, Drum & Anderson, Noel & Company, Kirlin and Fitzgibbon and Ashbridge and Teal, they be authorized to erect at the junction of Meredian and Illinois Streets, upon Out Block No 123, owned by A. W. Russell, a suitable building on Magazine for the storage of Gun Powder, the building to be perfectly fine and thief proof, to have but one opening and that secured by double Iron doors, And it is also ordered that all persons having a greater quantity of powder than twenty five pounds shall be required to store the surplus in some building or magazine simalar to the above, and that the Marshall be directed to enforce the ordinances on the subject as contained in chapter 7 and sections 13,14,15,16 & 17, The Council reserving the right at all times to alter and amend the foregoing order, and to fix the price of storage.

A petition signed by T A Morris & others praying the Council to Cause Harvey Bates to remove his ware house on Merrill Street which they say stands 6 inchens in said street, was read, and on motion was laid upon the table.

A petition signed by C & J Cox and others praying the Council to grant them the privalage of making and paveing with stone a gutter on the South side of Washington Street between Meredian and Illinois Streets was read, and on motion, the prayor of the petitioners granted by the Council.

A petition signed by Vanblaricum and others praying the Council to cause Siten Price and Company to fill up the side walk on the North side of Washington Street near the Canal in Block No 52 was read, and on motion, the Council ordered the Street Commissioner to Notify them or their agent to fill up said side walk, and in case they failed to do so, the same to be done at

the expence of the City Council, and the amount to be taxed against said Lot.

On Motion the Council adjourned
