The civil Engineer reports to the city council

1st That Peter Hight, to whom the council awarded the contract for grading and graveeling Mississippi street and sidewalks, between Michigan and New York Streets, has failed to appear and give security for the performance of the work

2 That Hans Kaugerman, to whom the council awarded the

contract for grading and graveling Liberty Street and sidewalks, between Washington and New York Streets, has failed to produce security.

I beg leave to present the following report of the condition of our fire department. We now have in effective service, four first class engines, and two second class, and three more Second class that we can bring in as occasion may require the pump for filling cisterns has been procured, and works well at a cost of one hundred and twenty dollars, we have a large amount of hose in bad condition and are fast rotting out because they are not properly cleaned and it is impossible so to clean them, without a good force pump one that will work the sand and gravel from the seams and joints, our hose only last five

years, when they should last at least twelve with proper treatment, I would therefore recommend that you cause to be procured one force pump for each engine house. I think that five of them will not cost more than three hundred dollars, all complete with hose such pumps will save at least five hundred dollars a year in the wear of hose all of which is respectfully submitted

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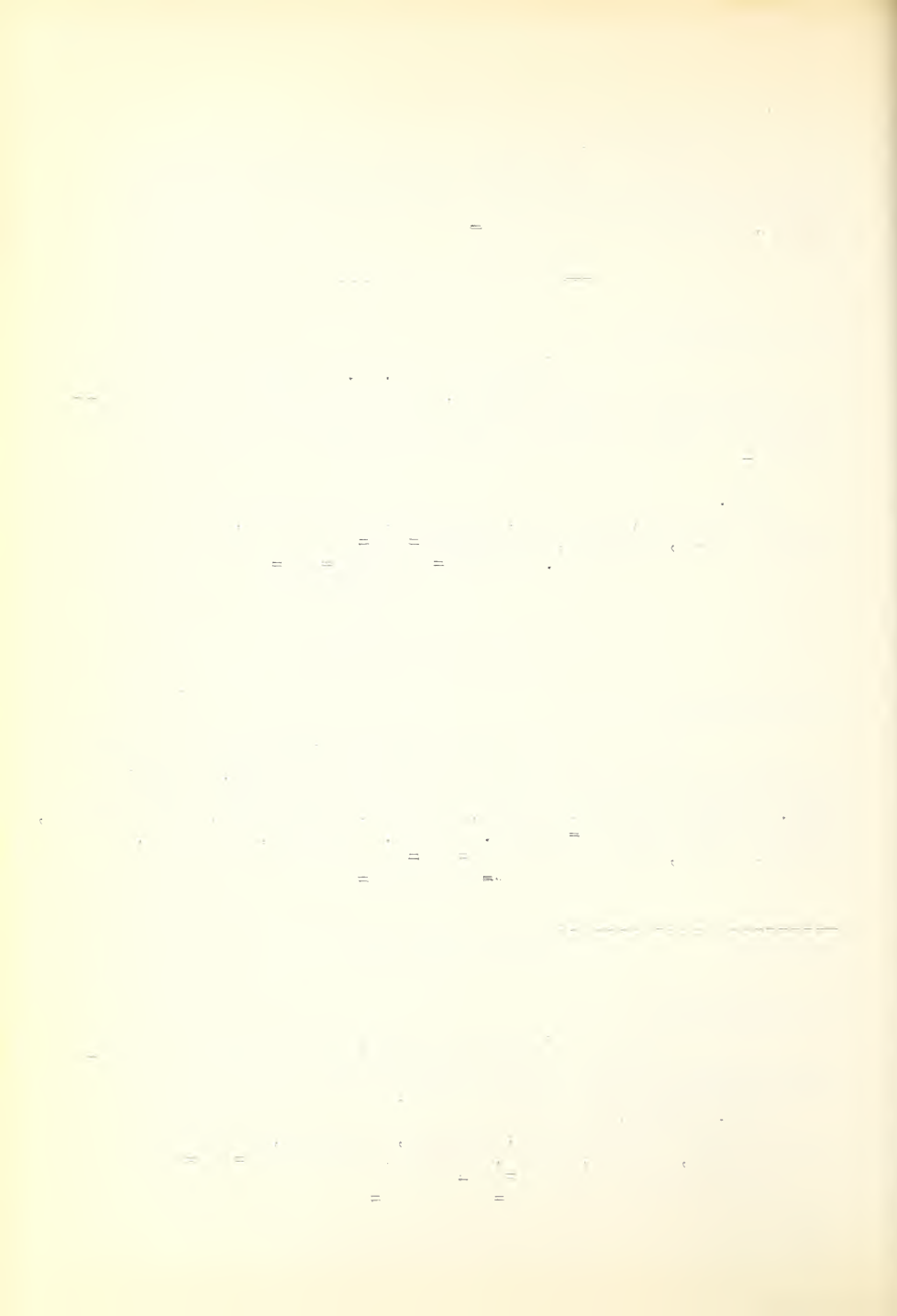

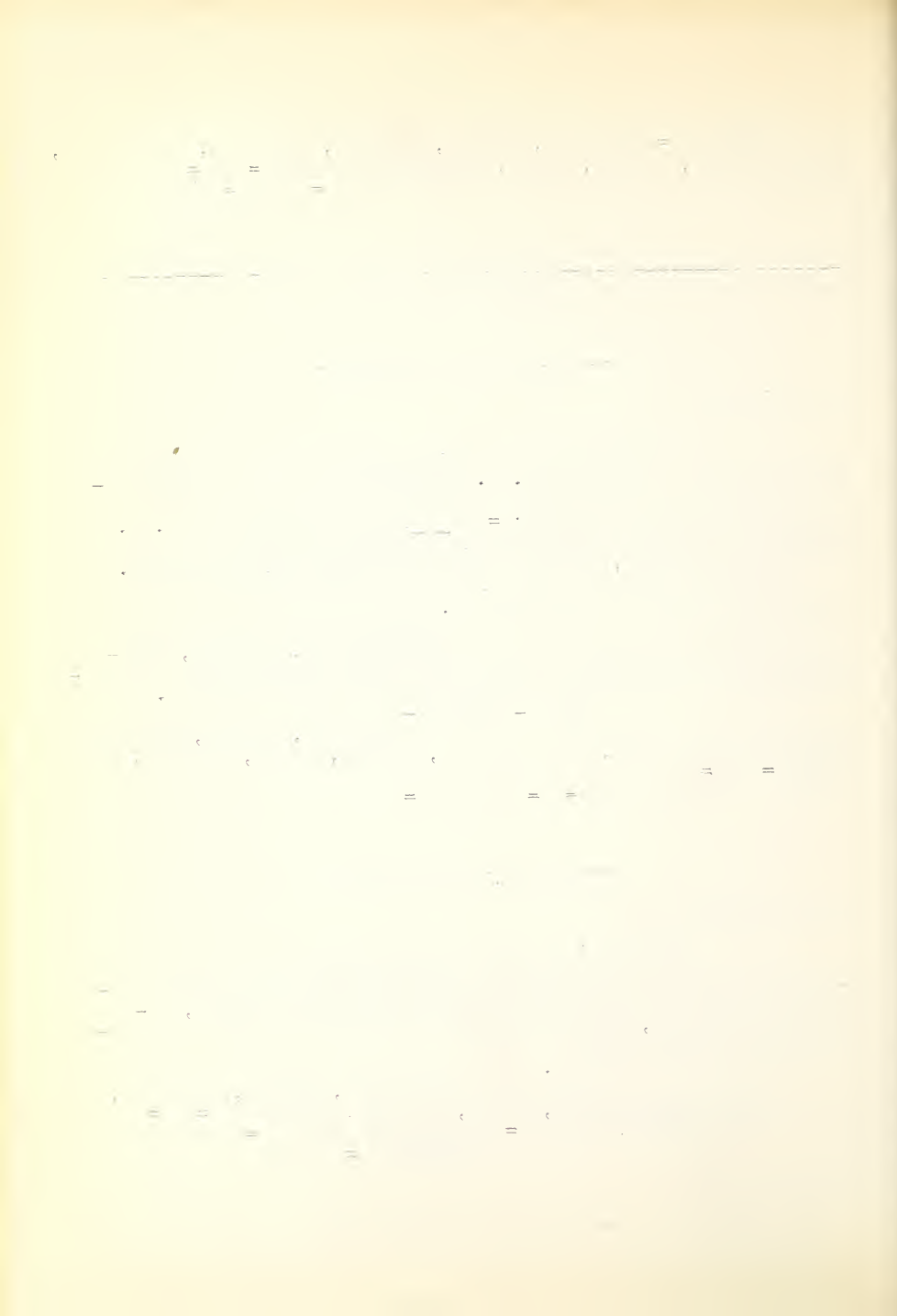

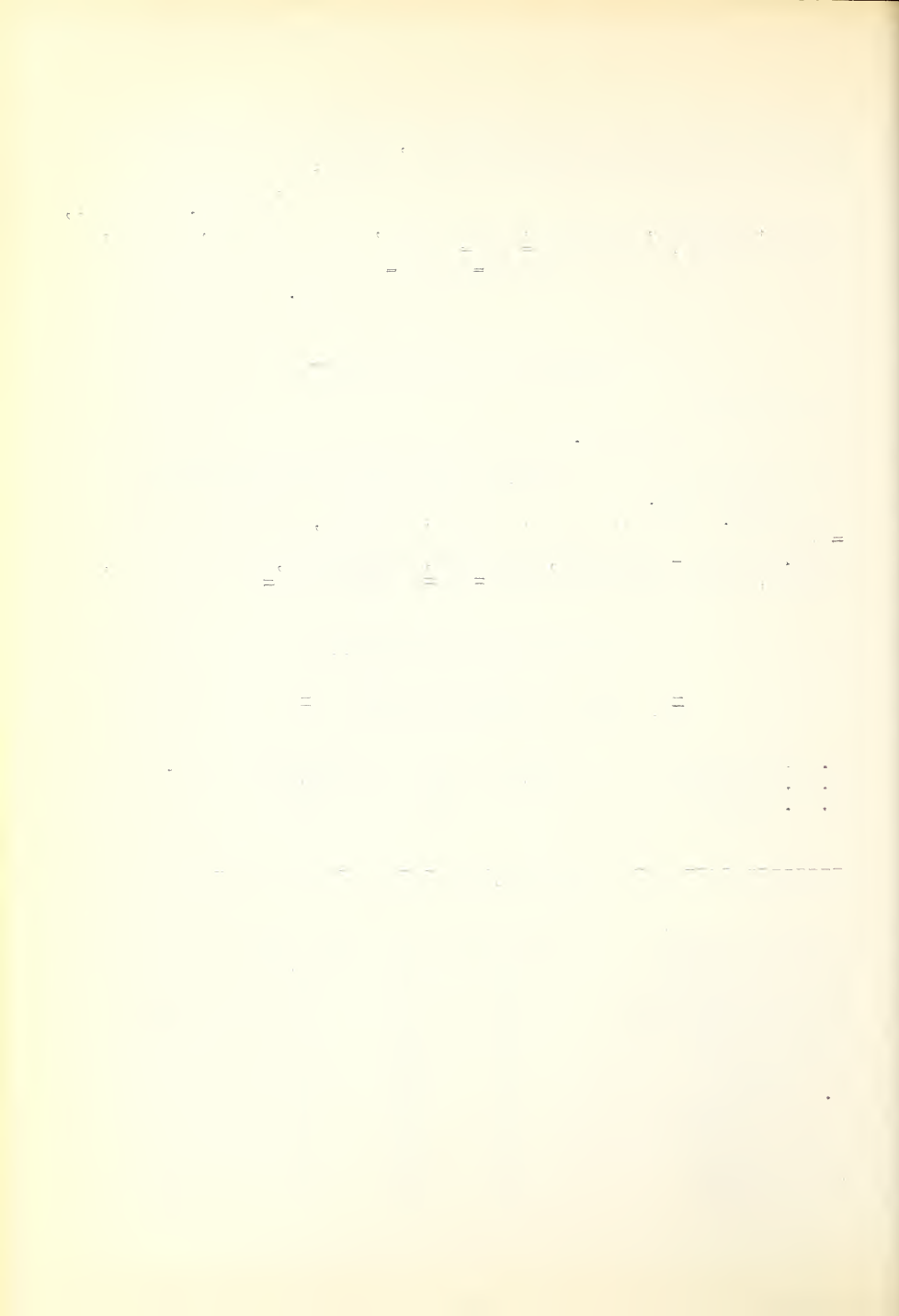
