

Council Chamber April 29th 1859

Persuent to adjournment the Council met this evening thirty minutes before 8 Oclock P.M. Present his Honor Mayor Maxwell and all the Councilmen.

On motion of Mr. Cottrell

The reading of the Ordinance as revised and systematized by H.B.Cotton was by unanimous consent continued from the point where the same ceased at the last meeting of the Council Whereupon there were so read the following Ordinances Viz.

- Ordinance 9. Regulating the Lighting of the City
 " 10 Relative to omnibusses runners &c at the Union Depot and the general protection of travelers in the City
 " 11 Regulating and protecting the Public Markets
 " 12 Relative to the licening and regulating of extraordinary trades and establishments.
 " 13 Protecting public marality Decency and Order
 " 14 Regulating public safety comfort and convenience
 So far as as throughout the Second Section thereof at which point on motion of Mr. Porter such reading was suspended.

On motion the Council adjourned to meet on Saturday evening April 30th 1859 at 7 Oclock P.M.

The following offered by Mr. Vandegrift at a previous meeting of the Council.

Resolved that the Civil Engineer be directed to set the stakes for Lamp Posts on North Illinois Street and the remainder of Lamp Posts to be set on North Meridian Street ten feet from the front line of the lots bordering on said Streets.

On motion by Mr. Vandegrift the above Resolution was refered to the Committee on Gas.

Your Committee on Gas to whom was refered the above resolution at a previous meeting of the Council report adversely to the Resolution. Which report was concurred in.

On Motion the Council adjourned to meet on Saturday evening April 30th 1859 at 7 Oclock P.M.
