

PROCEEDINGS OF COMMON COUNCIL.

SPECIAL SESSION—MARCH 31, 1885.

The Common Council of the City of Indianapolis, met in the Council Chamber, Tuesday evening, March 31st, A. D. 1885, at half-past seven o'clock, in special session, pursuant to the following call:

To the Members of the Common Council of the City of Indianapolis:

City Architect D. A. Bohlen, submitted plans, drawings and specifications, together with estimates, for erecting a Market House and Public Building on the ground known as the "East Market Space," being the territory bounded by Delaware, Market, Alabama and Wabash streets, for approval, modification or rejection.

On motion by Councilman Thalman, the plans, etc., as submitted by the Architect, were approved.

On motion, the Common Council then adjourned.
