

PROCEEDINGS OF COMMON COUNCIL.

SPECIAL SESSION—OCTOBER 21, 1887.

The Common Council of the City of Indianapolis, met in the Council Chamber, Friday evening, October 21st, A. D. 1887, at eight o'clock, in special session, pursuant to the following call:

ABSENT, 7—viz: Councilmen Benjamin, Edenharter, Haugh, Howes, Mack, Reincke, and Rooker.

Councilman Thalman introduced the following entitled ordinance, which was read the first time:

G. O. 37, 1887—An ordinance authorizing the Indianapolis Natural Gas Company to lay and maintain pipes in the streets, alleys, avenues, lanes and public grounds in the City of Indianapolis, for the purpose of supplying said city and its inhabitants with natural gas, for heating purposes.

Councilman Cummings moved that the ordinance be referred to the Common Council as a Committee of the Whole, to be considered by the Committee at a meeting to be held next Monday afternoon, at 2 o'clock, and that the members of the Board of Aldermen be invited to be present and participate in the consideration of the ordinance.

Which was adopted.

On motion, the Common Council then adjourned.
