CHAMBER OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE }

Wednesday, March 12, 1873, 3 o'clock, P. M. }

The Common Council met pursuant to a call from the Committee on Fire Department.

Present—His Honor the Mayor, Daniel Macauley, in the chair, and the following members:

Councilmen Batty, Bigham, Bollman, Craft, Gibson, Hardesty, Kahn, Kennington, Pressly, Sherwood, Thalman, Wiles and Woodburn—13.

Absent—Councilmen Cottrell, Gimber, Reagan, Rush and Whitsit—5.

Mr. Craft, Chairman of the Committee on Fire Department, stated that the object of the meeting was to take action in regard to the funeral of the late Daniel Glazier, late Chief the Fire Department, and made a verbal report stating that the committee had made temporary arrangements with Charles Richmann to take charge of the Fire Department as Chief until the Council could take definite action in relation to the appointment of a regular Chief.

Which, on motion by Mr. Sherwood, was concurred in.

Mr. Batty moved that a Committee of Arrangements be appointed, and also, a Committee on Resolutions, of which the Mayor be chairman.

Which was adopted.

His Honor appointed as a Committee of Arrangements, the Committee on Fire Department, with His Honor and Councilmen Bollman and Wiles.

The Committee on Resolutions consists of His Honor, the Mayor, Messrs. Batty, Gibson, Bigham and Kennington.

On motion, the Common Council and City Officers agreed to attend the funeral as a body.

On motion by Mr. Hardesty, the members of the Fire Department were granted permission to hold a meeting at the Headquarters of the Fire Department for the purpose of making arrangements for the funeral.

On motion, the different Engine Houses were ordered to be draped in mourning.

On motion the Council adjourned.
